#### MATCH PREVIEW

**EDMONTON, A.B.** – After a long 13-day break in between matches, FC Edmonton returns to the pitch of Clarke Stadium to face the Indy Eleven on Saturday, May 27 in North American Soccer League (NASL) action.

The Eddies have had ample time to recover from five matches in 15 days after the club's match with the New York Cosmos on May 21 was rescheduled to June 7. The focus for the two weeks has been on rest, attacking, and working to snap out of a five-game winless streak (0W-2D-3L) dating back to a 2-0 loss to Miami FC on April 29.

"Coming back into training it's been business as usual, and I have to say the response from the players has been fabulous," FC Edmonton head coach Colin Miller said. "We focused on a lot of attacking elements this week in training and we've seen the benefits of that with some terrific finishing in free play and small-sided games."

Two playoff teams from 2016 in the Eddies and Eleven meet in another rematch of last season's Championship Semifinals after drawing 0-0 earlier this season at Michael A. Carroll Stadium. The Eleven are winless (0W-6D-2L) and had their 21-game home unbeaten streak snapped in a 2-0 loss to Miami last Saturday.

Clarke Stadium has traditionally been a fortress for the Eddies over the past few seasons, but they've been slow out of the gate at home to start this season after losing three out of four matches in Edmonton. The road back up the table can be a difficult task, and it begins with picking up points in your own stadium.

"We have to start winning these home games that we've been throwing away, and that's been unlike us as we've been very good at home," Miller said. "We know [Indianapolis] are a tough side and I thought they did well for spells against Miami [last Saturday]. We know they'll come here wanting three points after seeing what other teams have done."

"It's game on now for the players," Miller commented. "I need to see the right attitude, I need to see hunger and I need to see guys committed to helping us get back to the top half of the league. Some lads have really stepped up and put others under pressure for places, which is what I want now.

"We're in this together, and we know it's going to take nothing less than the continuation of the hard work that the guys have put in this week to get us the three points we need."

#### FC EDMONTON DENIED BY LATE WINNER AGAINST DELTAS

**EDMONTON, A.B.** -- FC Edmonton carried the play for 89 minutes, but a free-kick from San Francisco Deltas midfielder Cristian Portilla in the final minutes found its way untouched into the back of the net to give the visitors the three points in a 1-0 contest at Clarke Stadium on Sunday, May 14.

Despite positive opportunities for a go-ahead goal from FC Edmonton in the first half, the game remained scoreless after 45 minutes of play. Cristian Portillo scored the winning goal in the 89th minute of the match, while between the posts goalkeeper Romuald Peiser registered a clean sheet.

"It's absolutely devastating," FC Edmonton head coach Colin Miller said post-match. "I feel so bad for the players who put so much into that game. It was bad enough if we had drawn the game, but to get absolutely nothing is difficult. The difference was a mistake and that's what cost us. Take nothing away from this San Francisco team, they are very good and they provided an entertaining game as well, but to give up a goal like that is criminal."

Dustin was a key factor for Edmonton throughout the first half as he continued to cause all kinds of problems for the opposition. This time, the winger intercepted a ball in midfield, before playing a well-placed through ball in behind the Deltas' defence. Striker Jake Keegan ran onto the pass and was in on goal, but his left-footed effort went over the crossbar.

The last chance of the half fell to the visiting side. This time Bekker played in Tyler Gibson with a pass before he beat his man and fired a shot from close range that was well saved by the left-hand of Konopka. The 0-0 score line would hold through 45 minutes of play.

The Eddies nearly opened the scoring within the first two minutes of the second half. After a direct ball over the top from Abdoulaye Diakité, Keegan found himself in on a breakaway, but his effort went inches wide of the near post.

The Deltas would get the winning goal in the 89th minute of play. The opposition were awarded a free-kick after Ledgerwood brought down his man on the left-wing. On the ensuing free-kick, Portilla whipped in a cross towards the back-post that evaded everyone in the box and bounced into the far-corner of Konop-ka's net. Portilla's goal held through the remaining minutes of the match as the visiting side secured all three points.

"The players' attitudes have been terrific," Miller said. "The players are giving absolutely everything at the moment and we hope our luck will change soon. We did not deserve to lose the game; we should have picked up more from this game. The players are working very hard to turn things around. We are creating chances and getting into good areas, but we aren't finishing at the moment."

#### **ABOUT FC EDMONTON**

The North American Soccer League is a professional soccer league established in the United States and Canada. The NASL member teams are: Puerto Rico FC. Carolina RailHawks, FC Edmonton, Indy Eleven, New York Cosmos, Jacksonville Armada, Miami FC and the San Francisco Deltas.

The NASL season is played under a split-season format. The Spring and Fall Season Champions will each host a semifinal in the league's four-team postseason tournament, The Championship, and the pair will be joined by the next two clubs with the best combined records. The top seed in The Championship will be awarded to either the Spring or Fall Champion, depending on which has the better combined record in the regular season. The third and fourth seeds will then be determined by the teams' positions in the combined standings. The top-seeded team after the semifinals will host The Championship Final. If one club wins both season championships, the clubs posting the second, third, and fourth-best overall records will enter The Championship.
