GAME PREVIEW

INDIANAPOLIS - Head Coach Gary Smith and his surging Atlanta Silverbacks (3-6-6, 15 points) head to Michael A. Carroll Stadium to take on a tough Indy Eleven (4-6-4, 18 points) opponent.

Atlanta has racked up seven points in the last four games. It could also be argued that they should've been able to bring home ten. Either way, the Silverbacks are only five games into the Fall Season and almost have as many points as they did all spring. New players and formations have developed a confident Atlanta attack, and it's starting to pay dividends.

Jaime Chavez appears to be back in the form that made him such a crucial part of the team last year. Chavez's three goals in the Fall have now made him the team's leading goal-scorer. Atlanta's newly-acquired Junior Burgos, who appears to have reemerged in the squad after never missing a beat, now leads the team in assists and has been one of the best players during the Fall.

Indy Eleven has recorded five points in the fall and currently sit just three points away from a playoff spot. Atlanta's resurgence has placed them just six points out with plenty of games to play. The Silverbacks' match against Indy could be an important one to keep Atlanta flying up the table.

Indy has turned Michael A. Carroll Stadium into a fortress this season, only allowing one loss at home during NASL league play. Four out of their seven other home games were draws, as well. The team has yet to be defeated at home during the Fall Season, too.

Two players who won't be participating in the showdown will be Indy defender Eric Norales and Atlanta midfielder Michal Mravec. Both received red cards during last week's round of games.

Atlanta and Indy are level in their past four matches dating back to 2014. Both teams have only one win against the other, and the rest coming in draws. One player that is surely excited about facing the Eleven is Jaime Chavez. Chavez has three goals in team's last four outings against Indy.

LAST TIME OUT

EDMONTON, Can. — Jaime Chavez entered Sunday afternoon's showdown against FC Edmonton with the reigning NASL Play of the Week. He left with two more goals and an assist in the 10-man Atlanta Silverbacks, 3-1, victory at Clarke Field.

After a scoreless first half, Chavez and Atlanta (3-6-6, 15 points Combined Table) hijacked the match with a pair of goals in the first 20 minutes of the second half. Late substitute Shaka Bangura sealed Edmonton's fate with an exclamation point in the 88th minute.

"We certainly had one or two more opportunities than we did in past matches," Silverbacks head coach Gary Smith said. "This new (3-5-2) formation has had some encouraging signs since we implemented it (at the beginning of the Fall season). Going into halftime, we felt confident. We found our breakthrough in the second half. After adding the second — and then third — we knew there were three points to be had."

Atlanta — in its third consecutive away match of the Fall Season — scored a season-high three goals against the Eddies. In the Spring's meeting between the two teams, Edmonton escaped with a 4-2 victory at Clarke Field on May 24.

The Silverbacks opened the scoring in the 49th minute when Pedro Mendes fired a rocket from close range from the far post. Edmonton goalkeeper Matt VanOekel made the initial save, but parried the rebound across the face of his own goal. That's where a stampeding Chavez tapped in the tie-shattering strike.

He completed his brace 15 minutes later. The over-the-top delivery from Junior Burgos caught the in-stride Chavez, who clinically headed the ball onto his left foot and into VanOekel's net.

Chavez's pair against Edmonton brings his season total to four in NASL play and five in all competitions.

Just six minutes after Atlanta's second goal, center official Juan Marquez reduced the visitors to 10 men with nearly 20 minutes left to play. Just four minutes after entering the match for Burgos, Michal Mravec was dealt a straight red card for a tackle in the 72nd minute.

It took 13 minutes for Edmonton to take advantage, but it destroyed Atlanta and Steward Ceus' clean sheet with a Tomi Ameobi goal in the 85th minute.

The Eddies' goal was negated just three minutes later. The cross-field ball from Chavez sprung Bangura for his third goal of the season after a calm rounding of VanOekel.

"There's no lacking in this group," Smith said. "We had to find the right formation and shape for everyone to fit into. Never at any point have I doubted this team. They showed (on Sunday) what I've never doubted. To this point on this trip, I felt we deserved more than we got. Today was a different story.

"We're delighted to put this victory in our pocket and now we are ready to move on."

#1 STEWARD CEUS GOALKEEPER



Steward Ceus, a 27-year-old goalkeeper with international appearances for the Haitian national team, was signed on Jan. 14, 2015. He reunites

with head coach Gary Smith, who drafted him as the 37th overall selection in the 2009 MLS SuperDraft. Smith and Ceus were together with the Colorado Rapids from 2009-11. Ceus' MLS debut came late in 2012 when he started the final three matches of the season. He made one regular season appearance for the Rapids in 2013 before moving to Finland to play with Närpes Kraft Fotbollsförening in 2014. Ceus has earned seven caps for the Haitian national team.

#13 CHRISTOPHER CHRISTIAN DEFENDER



On March 17, the Club announced the addition of Christopher Christian after a preseason trial with two appearances in friendlies. With professional experience

in both Europe and Africa after four years as a starting center back with four goals and an assist at Villanova, Christian offers versatility with both athletic and technical ability but also as a seasoned veteran. He played for Polish second-division side Motor Lublin in 2012-13 before joining Ghanaian Premier League side Liberty Professionals in 2013-14

#3 PAUL BLACK DEFENDER – FULL BACK



Before signing with Atlanta in January 2015, the English full back played for Cheltenham Town in England's League Two. Black is seasoned with 132

appearances in the English lower divisions – including 103 matches with League One side Oldham Athletic. The Manchester City youth product joined Oldham after becoming a regular in the starting eleven during the 2006-07 season and serving as captain for the youth squad.

#4 SIMON MENSING DEFENDER - CENTER BACK



Mensing has featured in both the English League Championship and the Scottish Premier League throughout his 15-year career. Mensing appeared 148 times for

Hamilton Academical, starting with a threemonth loan deal in 2007. After netting three goals in five matches, Hamilton signed Mensing permanently, making way for the club's promotion to the Scottish Premier League in 2007-08 as Division One champions. The steady center back served as captain for Scottish club Livingston, appearing in 27 matches with a pair of strikes – including a penalty kick conversion in his debut in 2013.

#10 HANS DENISSEN FORWARD



2013 NASL Best XI selection Hans Denissen joined Atlanta in February 2015 after spending 2014 with the New York Cosmos. Before that, was a member of the

San Antonio Scorpions before that, including an award-winning 2013 campaign during which he tallied 12 league goals. A former Dutch youth international, Denissen started his senior career in 2003 with hometown club Willem II, featuring in both the Eredivisie and Europa League.

#25 FERRETY SOUSA MIDFIELDER



Originally from the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Sousa grew up in Raleigh, N.C. The 5-foot-6 midfielder played for the Carolina RailHawks U-23 team

when they won the USASA national championship in 2011. Before joining the Silverbacks, Sousa most recently played with French side FCM Aubervilliers before participating in the NASL Combine in 2013.

#2 RAUWSHAN MCKENZIE DEFENDER



The 6-foot-1 center back has appeared in 39 MLS matches since 2008, nailing down defensive duties for the Kansas City Wizards (2008-09), Real Salt Lake (2010-

lanta in 2014. Bangura offers a wealth of football experience across the globe, boasting a resume featuring runs in the Indonesia Super League, Cypriot First Division, Thai Premier League and U.S. Soccer's third-tier USL.

#8 DOMINIC OPPONG MIDFIELDER



A fresh face at defensive midfielder, the 29-yearold Ghanaian-born Oppong featured for FC Edmonton in 37 matches in 2011-12 before joining AC Oulu in the

Finnish second division last year. He made 23 appearances in Finland's Ykkönen, finishing 13-8-6 in fourth place and just three points off a promotion into the first division. He debuted for the Canadian Under-20 Men's National Team in 2005, appearing in all three group-stage matches at the Francophone Games in Niamey, Niger.

#9 JAIME CHAVEZ FORWARD



Chavez, 27, joined the Club in April 2015 and scored 12 goals in all competitions in his first NASL season. He led the team with 31 total appearances, scoring

nine goals in 27 league matches and three goals in four U.S. Open Cup games. Before signing for Atlanta, Chavez played at Cal FC of the USASA. Chavez started his senior career with PDL side Hollywood United Hitmen in 2009, standing as the club's leading scorer in its inaugural season with 10 goals. He remained with the Hitmen the following year, and again led the team in scoring with 11 goals.

#17 MICHAEL REED MIDFIELDER
