Match Preview

FC Edmonton (5-4-4) head to Michael A. Carroll Stadium in Indianapolis to take on Indy Eleven (3-3-7), Sept. 19 at 5:30 p.m. MT. The Eddies will be looking to win back-to-back matches for the first time this Fall Season as they aim for a North American Soccer League (NASL) post-season berth.

Edmonton has begun to find their footing in recent weeks after registering a draw and victory against Minnesota United FC and Tampa Bay Rowdies, respectively. Each of the two fixtures provided the Eddies with their own unique set of challenges, including playing a man down for over an hour versus the 'Loons before fielding a new-look lineup following injuries to striker Tomi Ameobi and midfielder Ritchie Jones against the Rowdies. Edmonton has not conceded an open-play goal in over three matches.

Wins have come few and far between this Fall Season for Indy, who sit 10th overall in the NASL's Combined Standings. Despite their current standing, Indy remains just three points back of the sixth-place Eddies in what is a jam-packed league table. Indy's most recent home match on Sept. 9 resulted in a 3-0 victory over Jacksonville Armada. Eleven were unable to keep the momentum going into last weekend's match, however, as they fell to San Antonio Scorpions by a 2-0 scoreline.

Saturday will mark the third and final meeting of the season between Edmonton and Indy, with the team splitting the two previous meetings. The team's most recent encounter occurred Aug. 5 at Clarke Field, with captain Albert Watson and Eddies leading scorer Tomi Ameobi registering goals for the home side in a 2-0 win.

"We know we have to be at our best if we're going to get a result because we are playing at one of the most difficult venues in the league," FC Edmonton head coach Colin Miller stated. "With a big crowd and them in the playoff hunt as well, there is still everything to play for. I'm hoping the experience in our group will stand up on Saturday night and I'm very excited to see the way our team plays."

FC Edmonton (3W-2D-3L) recorded a clean sheet in a 2-0 home win over Indy Eleven, Aug. 5 in North American Soccer League (NASL) action in a match presented by Oodle Noodle at Clarke Field.

Eddies captain Albert Watson opened the scoring for the Eddies in the first half, while Tomi Ameobi would go on to double the Eddies lead in the second half from the penalty spot. Goalkeeper Matt VanOekel earned the clean sheet in net.

FC Edmonton would take the lead on 16 minutes through Watson. The defender met Laing's in-swinging corner-kick with a thumping header that found the left corner of the net for the 1-0 lead.

VanOekel was forced into action towards the end of the first-half when Indy generated some offensive momentum. Van Oekel had to make two quick saves, first on Wojciech Wojcik after the forward struck a shot from range and then another save from in close after Charlie Rugg attempted a shot from a tight angle.

Ten minutes into the second half, the Eddies came close to doubling their lead. Laing found Ameobi with a terrific cross, but the striker's header from six-yards-out went just over the crossbar.

The Eddies struck again on 69 minutes after Laing earned his side a penalty kick. After receiving a cross-field pass from teammate Fordyce, Laing flicked the ball in the box, striking the hand of Indy defender Judson McKinney. Ameobi stepped up and found the back of the net with a calm finish.

Edmonton's defense would hold strong for the remaining 20 minutes of the match to earn their third clean sheet victory of the Fall Season.

Goalkeepers

#1 Matt VanOekel: VanOekel comes to FC Edmonton from Minnesota United FC. He has played with Minnesota since 2010 and their days as NSC Minnesota Stars. His goals against average at the end of 2014 was 0.95 after 20 matches and 50 saves.

#23 John Smits: In 2009, Smits set a Canadian University record with 12 shutouts in 15 games and only 3 goals against. He also made 3 National Championship appearances with the U of T Varsity Blues. Smits won the 2014 NASL Golden Glove award after posting a 0.90 goals against average (GAA) after six shut-outs and 62 saves.

#21 Tyson Farago: In 2013 Farago played with WSA Winnipeg in the PDL. During his season with the team, he recorded 107 saves to earn him the top spot in the league. Farago signed with FC Edmonton in the 2014 off-season and made his professional debut on November 2, 2014 in a 2-1 win over the Atlanta Silverbacks.

#26 Christian Kaiswatum: Joined the FC Edmonton first team after being a part of the FCE Academy program. Kaiswatum will be the second Academy player to join the first team ranks in the 2014 season. In total, the 18 year-old Kaiswatum will be the sixth FCE Academy alumni on the team.

Defenders

#2 Allan Zebie: Zebie first joined the FC Edmonton family in 2012 as part of the FCE Academy program and signed with the first team during the 2015 offseason. In 2012 he was invited to the U-20 camp under Nick Dasovic and was called-up to three more camps and finally, the CONCACAF Men's Under-20 Championship in 2013.

#3 Eddie Edward: With MLS and previous NASL experience before joining the Eddies in 2013, this right-back made over 40 appearances with the club and earned over 3600 minutes.

#12 Kareem Moses: After playing with several different clubs in Trinidad and Tobago, this centre-back has also earned a call-up to the senior team and he made his senior National team debut on August 15, 2012 in a friendly against Canada. Since then has made eight more appearances with the national team. Moses made 26 appearances with the Eddies in his first season with the club.

#5 Albert Watson: Watson joined FC Edmonton in the offseason of 2013. After suffering an early injury in preseason training camp, he bounced back to join the team in May of 2013. Watson has been named to the NASL Team of the Week four times in 2014.

#22 Michael Nonni: Nonni played in Germany with SV Wilhelmshaven, a German fourth division team. After his time in Germany, he came once again back home to Canada where he played with the FC Edmonton Academy squad in the summer of 2012, before moving up to the first team in 2013. Starting off his time at FC Edmonton as a midfielder, Nonni has found his place in the Eddies squad as a right-back and in the 2014 season.

#15 Mallan Roberts: Signing his first professional soccer contract in 2013, Roberts made his FC Edmonton debut on April 28, 2013 against San Antonio Scorpions. He scored his first goal with the club on June 30 versus Minnesota United FC in a 3-1 victory for the Eddies. In 2014, Roberts earned 1101 minutes during the NASL season.

#24 Johann Smith: Smith began his professional career with England's Bolton Wanderers in 2007. He has seen stints with a variety of clubs since then, including 14 appearances with Major League Soccer's Toronto FC from 2008-09. In 2014, Smith played with both Adelaide Raiders and Cumberland United National Premier League South Australia (NPL South Australia), a semi-professional league.

#25 Marko Aleksic: Under the guidance of his father, the centre-back began playing soccer with Edmonton Inter at the age of 10. His next soccer move was with the FCE Academy for the next three years, in 2014, Aleksic earned his spot in the FC Edmonton first team and his first professional soccer contract at 17. He made his professional debut on April 26, 2014 in a 1-0 loss against Minnesota United FC.

Midfielders

#6 Dustin Corea: Corea was a recent participant in this year's edition of the prestigious Gold Cup tournament as a member of El Salvador's national team, registering a goal versus Costa Rica in a 1-1 draw. The left-footed, product of Los Angeles, Calif. made 20 appearances for CD FAS of the Salvadoran Primera División through 2014-15, posting five goals in 1648 minutes of playing time.

#8 Ritchie Jones: Jones has played with several other English clubs, but most

recently found himself across the pond on trial with Major League Soccer side San Jose Earthquakes. Jones then made the choice to come to Canada and sign with FC Edmonton in the 2014 NASL off-season. In 2014 Jones made 22 appearances and tallied over 1600 minutes.

#17 Lance Laing: After impressing during an open tryout, Lance Laing signed with the Fort Lauderdale Strikers in 2011. Laing signed for FC Edmonton in the 2013 off-season and played 2160 minutes in his first year with the club. In 2014, the defender turned into a midfielder and played the majority of the Fall Season in left midfield. He tallied a team-leading seven goals and earned himself a spot on the NASL Best XI for 2014.

#7 Cristian Raudales: Played his college soccer at Florida Gulf Coast University. When he graduated in 2011, he left the program as the all-time leader in points (43) and also goals scored (19). From University, Raudales left for Germany and played in the German fourth division for BSV Rehden. Joining the Eddies midway through the 2014 season, Raudales earned over 800 minutes in 13 appearances.

#10 Tomas Granitto: The child of Argentinean's born in El Salvador - 21 year-old Granitto has played for the El Salvadorian U-20 national team at the highest level - the 2013 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Turkey. Granitto has been playing his club soccer with Club Deportivo Luis Ángel Firpo in El Salvador's first division, where he made an appearance in the CONCACAF Champions league with the squad. He signed with FC Edmonton in the 2015 offseason.

#11 Thiago de Freitas: de Freitas arrives from AOT Alimos (A.O Trachones F.C.) where he played a half season in Greece's second division. Prior to Greece, de Freitas spent a year in Israel with Hapoel Nir Ramat HaSharon, collecting two goals and two assists in 18 matches. The well-travelled, 27-year-old central midfielder has played in a multiple countries that also include Hungary and Portugal.

#14 Sainey Nyassi: Nyassi began his soccer career in Gambia, his home nation, for GFA League First Division Gambian Ports Authority. He was scouted by Major League Soccer's (MLS) New England Revolution in 2007 and signed with the club shortly after. Nyassi remained with the Revolution until 2013 when he signed with D.C. United until 2014.

#19 Hanson Boakai: Boakai signed his first professional contract with FC Edmonton in 2013 and in the following season made three appearances with the team including his professional debut against Carolina RailHawks in June 2013. Boakai was 16 years-old at the time and therefore holds the NASL record for being the youngest player in the league. Boakai earned his first senior Canadian Men's National team call up in November 2014.

#27 Pablo Cruz: Cruz arrives in Edmonton following a stint with San Antonio Scorpions after spending three years as a member of Atlanta Silverbacks, where he played from 2012-14. Last fall season, the 23-year-old, attacking midfielder accumulated three goals and three assists through 16 matches and 1,101 minutes played in the Fall Season.

Strikers

#16 Daryl Fordyce: Fordyce signed with FC Edmonton in 2013. During his first season with the club, he was FC Edmonton's leading goal scorer for the 2013 season. Fordyce scored six goals in the 2014 NASL season and has scored 13 times since joining the club.

#13 Frank Jonke: In 2011, Jonke signed with FC Inter Turku out of Finland and the following season signed with FF Jaro. At the end of the season he was awarded fan favourite and golden boot for the team award. After resigning with FF Jaro for another season, Jonke received his first senior Canadian National team call-up for a camp in the United States. Frank Jonke signed with FC Edmonton in the 2014 off-season.

#18 Tomi Ameobi: Starting his professional career with Leeds United, Ameobi has played in the United Kingdom and Iceland. Most recently, he played in Finland with VPS. He earned over 1600 minutes in 23 matches in 2014 and scored six goals.

#9 Sadi Jalali: After playing with the Edmonton Juventus, he spent 6 months with the Whitecaps Residency, and also 6 months in Germany. Jalali joined the FC Edmonton Academy program in 2012 and signed with the first team in 2013.

Head coach **Colin Miller** is no stranger to soccer in North American soccer as he was the youngest player to play in the NASL with the Toronto Blizzard in 1982. Miller also has 61 international caps for the senior Canadian Men's Soccer team and has been the interim head coach for the team on two occasions. Signing a three-year contact extension in the fall of 2014,
