OPEN CUP RUN OPENS UP WITH REMATCH:

Indy Eleven's potential run in the 2016 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup will open up the same way its abbreviated stay in the 2015 tournament began – and ended – with a Third Round match-up against USL side Louisville City FC at IUPUI's Carroll Stadium.

Wednesday's contest will be a grudge match for the "Boys in Blue," who fell 0-2 to LCFC in added extra time last May 27. After a scoreless 90 minutes of regulation, goals late in added extra time by Louisville's Nate Polak (115') and Sidney Rivera (120') would bring Indy Eleven's cup run to an early and disappointing end. The winner of Wednesday's match will get a Fourth Round meeting with MLS' Chicago Fire SC on June 15, with Chicago set to host the "Boys in Blue" or travel to Louisville depending upon the result.

Indy Eleven is 1W-2L-0D during its two previous USOC runs, having defeated the then-Dayton Dutch Lions 5-2 in its 2014 debut (3rd Round) before being downed by MLS' Columbus Crew 2-1 in the 4th Round, a game that also went into added extra time on the campus of the University of Akron.

STREAKING TOWARDS THE TOP: It might not have been the three-point result Indy Eleven was looking for, but last Saturday's 1-1 draw at Jacksonville served the dual purpose of pushing Indiana's Team into sole possession of second place in the NASL Spring Standings and stretched its single-season club record unbeaten streak to eight games (3 wins & 5 draws).

Prior to this year, the squad's previous single-season best unbeaten runs were a pair of five-gamers that ended the 2014 Fall campaign and spanned the 2015 Spring and Fall Seasons. Indy Eleven's current eight-game stretch is now one off its overall club-record undefeated streak of nine games (4 wins & 5 draws), achieved when it tacked a four-game run to start 2015 onto its end-of-2014 stretch.

INJURY REPORT: The midweek affair against Louisville FC will see several Boys in Blue ruled out of action, with MF **Brad Ring** (R MCL sprain) and DF **Lovel Palmer** (L lower leg injury) the only ones of any long-term concern at the time. MF **Sinisa Ubiparipovic** is continuing to progress from a R hip injury and could be in line for minutes this weekend at The Miami FC. Meanwhile, DF **Greg Janicki** is also coming back well from a facial fracture and concussion symptoms suffered during a nasty collision in the team's May 21st win over Minnesota, but his status for the weekend affair in South Florida will be determined late in the week. Everyone else on the Indy Eleven roster will be available to give at least some minutes for this week's "double dip" of contests over the next four days.

SPRING TITLE STILL WITHIN REACH: While the New York Cosmos went four points ahead of the second-place Eleven last weekend, the Boys in Blue remain very much within grasp of a Spring Season title with just two games remaining.

Indy will likely need a pair of wins at 10th place Miami FC this Saturday and at home against Carolina next weekend to claim the crown, but it will definitely need some help from the Fort Lauderdale Strikers, who New York closes out its Spring slate against this weekend in South Florida. If New York loses, a tie for Indy Eleven on Saturday will keep it in contention for the Spring's top spot – but it will also leave it in line to be caught by a chasing pack of no less than five teams within two points of it in the standings. Meanwhile an Indy win and a New York loss or draw would put Indy in prime position to capture its first piece of hardware when Carolina comes to "The Mike" next Saturday. ATTACK AWAKENING: Indy Eleven began the season by using defense to accumulate points, but the squad's attack has certainly been doing its fair share as the season has Spring has rolled along. In fact, Indiana's Team now ranks alone in third in the NASL with 11 goals in Spring Season play, behind only first-place New York (14) and Minnesota United FC (13). The awakening attack has allowed Indy Eleven's goal differential to climb to +4, the second-highest mark in the league and one that could prove beneficial down the stretch as the first tiebreaker in the standings (New York leads the league in GD at +8).

DOING IT WITH DEFENSE: Indy Eleven had been as steady as it could be in regards to its defensive unit to start the season, as coach Tim Hankinson rolled out the same back five in its first seven games – goalkeeper Jon Busch and defenders Nemanja Vuković (LB), Greg Janicki (LCB), captain Colin Falvey (RCB) and Lovel Palmer (RB). However, all good things must come to an end, as injuries to both Palmer and Janicki saw Hankinson insert a pair of 2015 defensive stalwarts in Marco Franco and Cory Miller into the lineup.

The duo allowed Indy Eleven to keep its stout defensive work in tact in 2016, as the 1-1 draw marked the seventh time in eight games that Indy had not allowed multiple tallies. The backline's cohesion and a commitment to defensive duties all across the pitch have led to some of the league's top defensive numbers through eight games – Indy's seven goals conceded is tied with Tampa Bay for the third fewest in the league, just one behind category leaders New York and FC Edmonton.

FLAIR FOR THE DRAMATIC: Indy Eleven has scored 8 of its 11 goals – and earned 9 of its 14 standings points – courtesy of finishes in the final 20 minutes of matches, including Justin Braun's 73rd minute equalizer last Saturday night in Jacksonville:

"WOJ" GOES ON LOAN: Indy Eleven announced May 18 that forward Wojciech Wojcik would be loaned to OKC Energy FC. The 23-year-old striker will stay in Oklahoma City for the rest of the USL side's 2016 season through September and report back to Indianapolis for the remainder of the Eleven's NASL campaign. Wojcik had made one appearance off the bench for Indy in 2016, this after he started 13 of 21 appearances during his first season with the club in 2015.

GORDON NAMED MVP OF JAMAICAN RSPL:

While he didn't impact the league's final two weekends ago, recently-added Indy Eleven forward Omar Gordon did manage to earn the MVP award for the Jamaican Red Stripe Premier League for his exploits across its season with Montego Bay United. Gordon finished the RSPL's season as the Golden Boot winner as well with 19 tallies, surpassing his Montego Bay United teammate Dino Williams, who was tabbed to join the "Boys in Blue" before being unable to pass his entrance physical last month. Gordon helped MBU to the 2013/14 Red Stripe Premier League title and to a runner-up finish in 2014/15, and scored one of its goals in their playoff semifinal round contest just a few weeks ago. The 24-year-old Gordon has started and played the full 90 minutes in Indy Eleven's last three matches.

ARE YOU EXPERIENCED? The common thread with Indy Eleven's batch of 12 newcomers can be summed up in one word – experience. Nine of the dozen new "Boys in Blue" are in their 30's, while two of the other three – Neil Shaffer (27) and Justin Braun (29) – have served as captain at their previous stop. The average age of the group (as of May 5) was 28.27 years, which ranked third in the NASL and just a shade behind Miami FC (28.28) and Rayo OKC (28.36). Goalkeeper Jon Busch, now in his 20th professional season in American soccer circles, serves as the oldest of the group at 39 years of age, while second-year forward Duke Lacroix is the youngster at 22.

ZAYED LATEST TO BRACE HIMSELF: While Eamon Zayed's two goals were enough to earn the full three points against New York on April 16, the Irishman ran out of time to chase the team's first-ever hat trick in NASL play. While Wojciech Wojcik tallied thrice in preseason play against Arizona United back in March and Blake Smith did the deed in U.S. Open Cup play in 2014 against the Dayton Dutch Lions, Indy Eleven is still looking for its first hat trick in league action. Zayed became the fifth member of the "Boys in Blue" to tally a brace in regular season play – and is the only one on that list currently on the roster:

OFFSEASON MAKEOVER: Indy Eleven named American coaching veteran Tim Hankinson as the club's second permanent head coach on Dec. 2, and changes to the roster of "Indiana's Team" would be soon to follow. As it turns out, the 22-man roster as it currently stands is split nearly down the middle between returning players and newcomers – a trend that carried over to Hankinson's coaching staff thanks to the return of Tim Regan to an assistant role and the addition of veteran goalkeeper Jon Busch, who will serve as the squad's goalkeeping coach in addition to the team's first-choice netminder. 10 of those 12 players would end up making their Indy Eleven debut on April 2 in Tampa Bay, with 8 of them being penciled into the starting lineup

HANKINSON AT THE HELM: Indy Eleven's offseason began in earnest on December 2, when veteran coach Tim Hankinson was named the second full-time head coach of "Indiana's Team." Indy Eleven is the latest stop on a now 36-year coaching journey that has seen Hankinson lead teams at nearly every level of the sport in the United States – including two years in the North American Soccer League and nine years in Major League Soccer – and taken him across the globe. The native of New York City is familiar with the NASL after being named the first head coach of the San Antonio Scorpions in 2012, helping the expansion squad to the league's regular season championship in his first season. Hankinson is now 23W-16D-18L in 57 games overall in the NASL, the first 50 of which came with San Antonio from 2012-13.

Hankinson was also one of the pioneers in Major League Soccer coaching circles during his nine years in the league from 1996-2004. His MLS tenure began in 1996 by serving as the nascent league's Director of Player Development for two seasons, during which he led the league's scouting and player development activities and coached the Nike Project-40 developmental team. Hankinson would move back to the full-time coaching ranks by taking the helm of MLS' Tampa Bay Mutiny from 1998-2000, helping the squad to postseason appearances in two of his three seasons. From there it was on to fellow MLS side Colorado Rapids, where he racked up three more playoff nods in four seasons from 2001-04. Between his start in coaching with a decade in the collegiate ranks and his stop here in the Hoosier State, Hankinson trotted the globe to coach club teams in Iceland, India, Brazil and, most recently, Jamaica, in addition to Guatemala's U-17 MNT.
