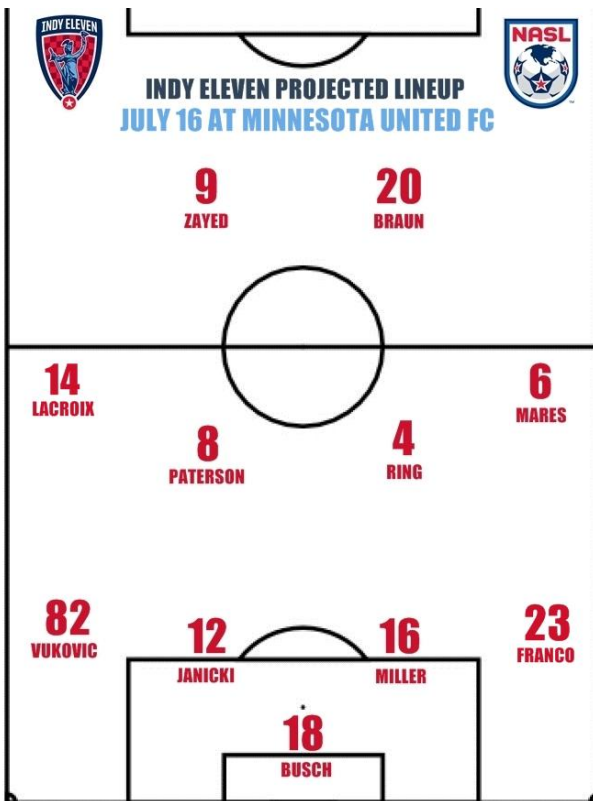

**LAST TIME OUT – INDY STRIKES HARD & FAST**

**VS. STRIKERS:** After a nearly three-hour wait to get things going Wednesday night, Indy Eleven couldn't wait to start scoring, using a relentless first-half attack to post a comprehensive 3-0 victory over the Fort Lauderdale Strikers at IUPUI's Carroll Stadium. The result brought Indy Eleven's undefeated streak to start the season to 13 games (6W-7D-0L, 25 pts. in Combined Season), and, more importantly, allowed Indy (2W-1D-0L, 7 pts. in Fall Season) to keep pace with the breakaway Cosmos (9 pts.) early in the Fall Season race.

After waves of storms delayed the start of the match until just after 10:30 p.m., it was Indy Eleven attacking in waves with intensity from the outset, paying off with forward Eamon Zayed's opener in the 10<sup>th</sup> minute. The Irishman bagged his seventh goal in league play after corralling Nicki Paterson's cross to the penalty spot, turning and placing his shot into the upper right corner past a helpless Diego Restrepo in the Strikers goal. Zayed's strikemate Justin Braun nearly doubled Indy's early advantage two minutes later, but his heavy hit from 25 yards rose just over the crossbar.

In the 21<sup>st</sup> minute it was Zayed playing provider for Indy's second as he popped a ball up the left for midfielder Duke Lacroix. The Eleven left flanker read the high bounce correctly and shielded off his defender before racing in on Restrepo and finishing from 12 yards out to make it 2-0 Indy. Just five minutes later Paterson would get his second helper of the evening off a corner kick service that captain Greg Janicki headed home, all but wrapping up the proceedings less than a half hour in.

The offensive onslaught by Indy would continue with a handful of clear cut chances across the final 15 minutes of the opening half, but the "Boys in Blue" would have to settle for the 3-0 lead at the end of the first half. Fort Lauderdale midfielder Geison Moura's second yellow card of the evening in the 41<sup>st</sup> minute would only make things worse for the visitors heading into the halftime break.

As expected, Indy Eleven came out of the locker room the aggressor with the man advantage. Nemanja Vukovic's dipping shot in the 51<sup>st</sup> minute had eyes for goal, but Restrepo did well to tip over for a corner. Luis Felipe Fernandes showed signs of life for the visitors on a rare foray forward with numbers in the 60<sup>th</sup> minute, his low shot from the top of the area forcing the first save of the night from Indy goalkeeper Jon Busch, who collected his second straight clean sheet – and fifth of the season – on the evening. The action would slow towards the finish, but Lacroix turned on the afterburners to create one more quality chance in the 81<sup>st</sup> minute, ending a lengthy run into the right side of the area by slamming a shot off Restrepo at his left post.

**LAST WEEKEND – MARES BIG ON BOTH ENDS**

**IN WIN OVER MINNESOTA:** Dylan Mares provided the latest set of late-game dramatics for Indy Eleven, scoring his first goal of the season 12 minutes from time and heading a ball off the line in the 90<sup>th</sup> minute to give the "Boys in Blue" a 1-0 victory over Minnesota United FC at IUPUI's Carroll Stadium. Indy goalkeeper Jon Busch stopped four shots for his fourth shutout of the season, including a massive penalty kick stop of NASL leading scorer Christian Ramirez late in the first half.

The result kept Indy Eleven undefeated through 12 games to start the 2016 season, and was preceded by the team lifting the league's Spring Season trophy in front of its appreciative fans.

Both sides' best chances within the first 20 minutes were finished – but they were also both nullified for offside, Eamon Zayed giving the Brickyard Battalion false hope just 50 seconds in, while Aaron Pitchkolan's header of Christian Ramirez's half-bike towards goal in the 18<sup>th</sup> minute fell to the same fate. Minnesota would take control of the better chances after the half hour mark, starting when Stefano Pinho's cross found the head of a darting J.C. Banks, but the Loons' central playmaker saw his 10-yard shot flash just wide of the right post.

In the 37<sup>th</sup> minute it was Pinho creating a penalty kick opportunity when he fell over the foot of Indy midfielder Dylan Mares just a step inside the box. However, Busch would deny Ramirez on the ensuing spot kick, diving low and to his left to bat the shot wide. Banks had a half chance off the ensuing corner when he hooked in a shot from 15 yards, but Busch jumped to his upper left 90 to pick the ball out.

The first chance of the second half fell to Minnesota left back Justin Davis, whose heavy shot from 30 yards was corralled by Busch on his line with a slight leap.

The game increasingly looked like it would be a stalemate until the 78<sup>th</sup> minute, when Mares made Minnesota's Lance Laing pay for a turnover in the final third. The Loons' midfielder tried to play out of his end but instead put the ball right on Mares' feet 25 yards out, from where he caught Ndjock off his line with a drilled effort into the upper right corner, giving Indy the lead.

Minnesota had two good chances to equalize in the final minutes, first in the 88<sup>th</sup> minute as the ball popped to Daniel Mendes at the top of the area, but the substitute midfielder's poke was deflected just wide of the right post. Off the ensuing corner Ramirez headed a ball that beat Busch but not Mares, who headed the ball himself off the line to keep Indy ahead into and through the five minutes of stoppage time.

### AFTER “LUCKY 13” INDY LOOKS FOR RECORD

**ON ITS OWN:** Wednesday night's 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale allowed Indy Eleven to re-write the NASL record book, its 13<sup>th</sup> straight game without a defeat to start the season (6W-7D-0L) equaling the longest undefeated streak in the league's modern history, now on even footing with the 2011 Carolina RailHawks and 2013-14 New York Cosmos. The “Boys in Blue” will look to claim the record all to itself with another point-bearing result on Saturday night at Minnesota.

If you want to get picky, the “Boys in Blue” have actually gone 15 competitive games without a defeat in 2016 when counting its two Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup contests (even its penalty kick defeat at the Chicago Fire in the Fourth Round technically goes down as a 1-1 draw). And while it doesn't count officially, if you want to throw the team's 1-0 exhibition win over Liga MX champion C.F. Pachuca onto the undefeated compilation as well, we won't stop you.

Prior to this year, Indy Eleven's previous club-record unbeaten streak was nine games spanning the 2014-15 campaigns. The club's single-season best unbeaten runs were a pair of five-games that ended the 2014 Fall campaign and stretched across the 2015 Spring and Fall Seasons.

**INJURY REPORT:** Indy Eleven's midseason “break” in June was anything but, however it did allow some of the “Boys in Blue” to return to full health, such as MF **Don Smart** (L LCL sprain), MF **Brad Ring** (R MCL sprain) and MF **Sinisa Ubiparipovic** (L hip). On the negative side of the report, three players – captain DF **Colin Falvey** (R hamstring), FW **Jair Reinoso** (L leg injury) and **Neil Shaffer** (R adductor) – were all out of consideration for the team's first three Fall Season games, although Reinoso recently returned to full training and will be available for selection this weekend in Minnesota.

### TORRADO AVAILABLE FOR NASL DEBUT IN

**MINNESOTA:** Indy Eleven surprised many in the soccer world on June 8 when it announced the signing of Mexican international midfielder Gerardo Torrado at a press conference in Los Angeles. The 37-year-old Torrado is the second-most capped player in Mexican National Team history (146) and spent the last 11 of his 19 professional seasons with Liga MX giant Cruz Azul – the last 10 as its captain. Torrado made his unofficial debut with a 62-minute appearance in the June 26 friendly vs. Pachuca. Unexpected visa issues kept “El “Borrego” in Mexico across the last week-plus, but he returned to Indy on Tuesday night and was on the bench as an available substitute Wednesday against Fort Lauderdale and has traveled with the club to Minnesota for Saturday's contest.

**SEEING RED:** Defender Lovel Palmer received the team's first red card of 2016 last weekend against Minnesota, but with it coming in a post-game fracas (which also saw Tiago Calvano red carded) it meant the “Boys in Blue” had the fortune of not playing a man down. The Jamaican right back will be available for selection for this weekend's rematch vs. the Loons in Minnesota. When adding on Geison Moura's “double yellow” ejection on Wednesday night against Fort Lauderdale, Indy's opposition has seen red in back-to-back outings.

**OPENING STRONG, FINISHING STRONGER:** Indy Eleven bucked its season-long penchant for late-game drama on Wednesday night by putting up all three of its goals on Fort Lauderdale within the first half hour. Indy Eleven has now scored 10 of its 20 goals in league play – and earned 14 of its 25 standings points and a little thing called the Spring Season title – courtesy of finishes past the 70<sup>th</sup> minute of games, including an incredible 8-0 advantage across the final 15 minutes (no other team in the NASL has scored more than 5 goals in the final 15 minutes).

Indy Eleven has gotten out of the gates strong as well, posting a 3-0 scoring advantage in the opening quarter-hour of games. Indy has conceded first just four times (tied for lowest in the league w/ NYC & MNU), while it has won 5 of 6 games in which it has scored first, tying the other (5/07 v FCE, 1-1).

**BREAKING EVEN WITH LOONS:** Thanks to last Saturday's win, Indy Eleven claimed its first season series against Minnesota in three tries. Indy's third straight win in the series brought the all-time mark between the two sides to 4W-0D-4L apiece, with Indy look to break the tie with its first-ever win at NSC Stadium (0-3-0) on Saturday.

### “MIRACLE AT THE MIKE” GIVES INDY SPRING

**TITLE:** Dramatic three-goal wins are few and far between, but Indy Eleven’s 4-1 win over Carolina on June 11 gave Indy the three standings points, four goals and three-goal winning margin it needed to surpass the New York Cosmos at the top of the table and earn the NASL’s Spring title – and The Championship automatic berth in November that comes along with it. Indy Eleven collected the Spring Season trophy from NASL Commissioner Bill Peterson prior to last Saturday’s 1-0 win over Minnesota at Carroll Stadium, and the NASL is expected to announce the date and time of Indy’s first-ever appearance in The Championship, set to take place the weekend of Nov. 4-6, in the coming weeks. The surprise result at “The Mike” included the club’s first-ever hat trick in NASL play by Eamon Zayed (15’, 65’ 85’) and Justin Braun’s third goal in four league matches to close out a memorable Spring campaign.

**DOING IT WITH DEFENSE:** Indy Eleven had been as steady as it could be in regards to its defensive unit to start the season, as coach Tim Hankinson rolled out the same back five in its first seven games – goalkeeper Jon Busch and defenders Nemanja Vuković (LB), Greg Janicki (LCB), captain Colin Falvey (RCB) and Lovel Palmer (RB). However, all good things must come to an end, as injuries have allowed Marco Franco and Cory Miller to collect several starts since late May.

While the personnel might have changed, the results have not as Indy Eleven has allowed just one goal or less in 14 of its 15 games across all competitions (12 of 13 in NASL play) in 2016. That includes five shutouts in NASL action, including the last two times out, with Indy carrying a 196-minute shutout streak into Saturday’s contest at Minnesota.

The team’s nine goals conceded are the second fewest in the NASL, just one behind FC Edmonton’s eight. With GK Jon Busch manning every minute in net, his resulting 0.69 GAA is the third-best among NASL ‘keepers (minimum of 540 minutes played) after 13 games behind only NYC’s Jimmy Maurer (0.60) and FCE’s Matt VanOekel (0.67).

**LARREA LET GO AFTER SPRING:** Indy Eleven’s addition of senior internationals Gerardo Torrado and Souleymane Youla in June created a numbers game that unfortunately saw the club unable to pick up the Fall contract option of midfielder Gorka Larrea. The affable Spaniard started four of his eight appearances while fighting injuries in the Spring season and totaled 436 minutes of action – including a yeoman’s 90 minutes in the team’s Spring Season-championship clinching effort on June 11 versus Carolina. The subtraction of Larrea leaves 23 “Boys in Blue” on the roster, counting the on-loan Wojciech Wojcik (USL side OKC Energy FC).

**“WON”-ZERO:** As good as Indy Eleven’s defense has been, it’s somewhat surprising that the team’s first 1-0 victory of the season – last weekend’s triumph over Minnesota – took 12 games to accomplish. After putting at least three goals on the board in three of its last seven outings, Indy Eleven is now tied for third in the NASL in scoring with 20 goals, behind just Minnesota (21) and even with New York. Meanwhile, Indy’s +11 goal differential is just one behind the Cosmos’ league high margin. Here’s the breakdown of Indy Eleven’s offensive output during the 2016 NASL season (wins in bold):

**OVER THE HUMP AT HOME:** After going winless in its first 12 home games at Carroll Stadium in 2014, Indy Eleven has since gone 13W-6D-5L in its last 24 league outings at “The Mike,” with its 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on Wednesday finally pulling its career league home record over the .500 mark. Carroll Stadium has become a fortress in 2016, with the “Boys in Blue” claiming 17 of 21 possible points and posting a +10 goal differential (16 GF / 6 GA) in its seven league outings thus far.

**LONG AND WINDING ROAD:** With its 2-1 win at Rayo OKC on April 30, draws in its four Spring Season trips to Florida and a Fall Season-opening 1-1 tie at Puerto Rico FC, Indy Eleven has earned points from all six of its away contests in 2016, the only team in the NASL to accomplish the feat. The results have pushed Indy Eleven’s all-time away record to 7W-14D-13L (36 GF / 55 GA).

**DEFENSIVE DUO FINISHING THE JOB:** With his second goal off a set piece in 2016 on Wednesday night, center back Greg Janicki jumped into a tie for third place on Indy Eleven’s scoring chart ... alongside another defender, left back Nemanja Vukovic. Their four combined goals through the first 13 games has even the output from the club’s midfield corps, with Omar Gordon, Nicki Paterson and recent first-time scorers Dylan Mares and Duke Lacroix all hitting the back of the net once. As to be expected, the forwards are pacing the squad’s scoring attack, with Eamon Zayed (7), Justin Braun (3), Souleymane Youla (1) and Jair Reinoso (1) combining for a dozen tallies, good for nearly one goal a game.

**ZAYED IN GOLDEN BOOT HUNT (AND OTHER LEAGUE LEADERS):** The top two goal scorers in the NASL – Indy's Eamon Zayed (7) and Minnesota's Christian Ramirez (8) – will square off for the second time in as many weekends. Zayed got back to within one goal of the top spot courtesy of his 10<sup>th</sup> minute game-winner on Wednesday night. Ramirez had the chance to tack onto his league-high total last weekend in Indy from the penalty spot, only to be denied by Jon Busch in the 38<sup>th</sup> minute.

**PATERSON & VUKOVIC HELPING OUT:** It took Indy Eleven until its fourth goal - in its fourth game of the season – to register an assist, but the “Boys in Blue” have helped out on 13 of their last 17 tallies, including all three in the romp over Fort Lauderdale Wednesday night. Midfielder Nicki Paterson collected two helpers in the midweek win, his second and third assist of the season tying him with left back Nemanja Vukovic for the team's lead in the category. The duo's 3 assists also places them tied for third across the NASL in the category alongside five other players. Paterson's two-assist effort Wednesday was the second for Indy this season alongside Vuko's double-helped night on June 11 vs. Carolina.

**CROSSED UP:** Expect to see a lot of balls pumped in from the flanks on Saturday, as Indy Eleven (244) and Minnesota (239) rank 1-2 in total crosses so far in 2016.

**GUINEAN INTERNATIONAL YOULA MAKES MEMORABLE DEBUT:** Souleymane Youla made his first NASL appearance in checkers a memorable one on July 2 at Puerto Rico FC. The 34-year-old Guinean international, signed on June 11, made his 11-minute appearance off the bench count, as his first shot in NASL play, a six-yard header off of Nemanja Vukovic's 92<sup>nd</sup> minute free kick, allowed Indy to steal a point at the death at Puerto Rico FC – and kept the “Boys in Blue” undefeated on the season. Youla made his competitive debut with Indy on June 15, when he played the final 51 minutes of the Eleven's Fourth Round U.S. Open Cup tie against MLS' Chicago Fire SC.

**SUDDENLY POSSESSED:** After enjoying the majority of possession just once in its 10 Spring Season games – and by the slimmest of majorities (51/49) at that on May 28 at JAX – Indy Eleven has seen the better of the ball in all three Fall games thus far at PRFC (61/39) and home against MNU (58/42) and FTL (52/48).

**INDY UPSETS LIGA MX CHAMP PACHUCA IN**

**FRIENDLY:** Indy Eleven used an early tally by striker Eamon Zayed, a fantastic goalkeeping display by Keith Cardona and plenty of last-ditch defending to down recently-crowned Liga MX Clausura season champion C.F. Pachuca 1-0 in an international friendly June 26.

It was Zayed putting Indy up just seven minutes in with an opportunistic goal, collecting a clumsily played ball by the Tuzos' center backs and before slotting low and left of Alfonso Blanco to put the home side up 1-0. Another poor back pass by Pachuca sprung Zayed on goal in the 26<sup>th</sup> minute, but the Irishman hurried his chip past an onrushing Blanco, missing just left of the frame to keep things close.

Cardona would get the full shift between the posts, and he came up big on a handful of occasions, most notably a kick save on Erick Sanchez's 15-yard blast in the 82<sup>nd</sup> minute.

**INDY KNOCKED OUT OF OPEN CUP BY –**

**CHICAGO IN PKs:** Indy Eleven took a Major League Soccer squad into added extra time of a Fourth Round Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup tie for the second time in three seasons, but would ultimately bow out to Chicago Fire SC 3-4 in penalty kicks following a 1-1 draw after the extra 30 minute session at Toyota Park on June 15.

It was the "Men in Red" enjoying the best chances through the scoreless 90 minutes of regulation, but Chicago's speedy attackers were missing the final touch when they weren't testing Indy goalkeeper Jon Busch, who made 7 stops on the night. At the end of the first 15 minute session of added extra time Justin Braun would put the visitors on top with a splendid left-footed finish, giving Indy's sizeable traveling contingent hope of advancing to the Round of 16. However, after missing several good looks throughout, Ghanaian striker David Accam would finally hit home for Fire SC, dekeing two defenders before finishing far post past Busch in the 111<sup>th</sup> minute, setting the stage for PKs.

Indy Eleven would go up 2-0 initially in penalties thanks to makes by Nicki Paterson and Eamon Zayed and a first chance miss from Kennedy Igboananike. However, Chicago 'keeper Matt Lampson would save Indy's next chances by Nemanja Vukovic and Daniel Keller, and Accam would polish off the fourth and final kick for Chicago to push the MLS'ers through to the final 16 team bracket.

**"WOJ" GOES ON LOAN:** Indy Eleven announced May 18 that forward Wojciech Wojcik would be loaned to OKC Energy FC. The 23-year-old striker will stay in Oklahoma City for the rest of the USL side's 2016 season through September and report back to Indianapolis for the remainder of the Eleven's NASL campaign. Wojcik had made one appearance off the bench for Indy in 2016, this after he started 13 of 21 appearances during his first season with the club in 2015.

**ARE YOU EXPERIENCED?** The common thread with Indy Eleven's batch of 14 newcomers in 2016 can be summed up in one word – experience. Eleven of the 14 new "Boys in Blue" – including this week's additions of Gerardo Torrado (37) and Souleymane Youla (34) – are in their 30's, while two of the other three – Neil Shaffer (27) and Justin Braun (29) – have served as captain at their previous stop. With the additions of Torrado and Youla this week, Indy Eleven boasts the oldest roster in the NASL. Goalkeeper Jon Busch, now in his 20<sup>th</sup> professional season in American soccer circles, serves as the oldest of the group at 39 years of age, while second-year forward Duke Lacroix is the youngster at 22.

**QUINTET OF ELEVEN ORIGINALS:** Three of those players – Brad Ring, Dylan Mares and Cory Miller – are among the five players remaining that spent time with Indy Eleven during its 2014 Inaugural Season. Ring, Mares and midfielder Don Smart were on the opening day roster in April 2014, while Miller and fellow defender Marco Franco would join two weeks apart that August and September, respectively.

**QUARTET OF HOOSIER STATE TIES:** Four players on the 2016 roster have links to the Hoosier State:

- MF Daniel Keller was born and raised in north suburban Carmel and attended Brebeuf Jesuit H.S. in Indianapolis
- Keller's one-time teammate at the University of Louisville, MF Dylan Mares, was born in South Bend, called Zionsville home and played his last collegiate season in 2013 with Indiana University
- Zionsville was also the former stomping grounds of defender Cory Miller, who moved to Indiana in his teens
- Midfielder Brad Ring may have been born in neighboring Illinois, but he earned his Hoosier State cred with a standout career at Indiana University from 2005-08
