LAST TIME OUT - IND 3 : 0 CAR (OCT. 15): Indy Eleven pushed its unbeaten streak at Carroll Stadium to 17 games following a 3-0 win over the Carolina RailHawks in front of 8,649 fans at IUPUI's Carroll Stadium.

Justin Braun's seventh goal of the season in the dying moments of the first half would make the difference, while Nicki Paterson's 77th minute free kick goal and Souleymane Youla's 90th minute finish added some insurance. The shutout was Indy Eleven's second straight and third in its last four outings and gave goalkeeper Jon Busch his 10th clean sheet on the season, tied for the third most in the NASL this season.

The game open at a strenuous pace, with the teams trading quality chances right off the bat. Carolina goalkeeper Brian Sylvestre stood on his head to keep Indy Eleven off the board, making kick saves against Dylan Mares in the 4th minute and Eamon Zayed in the 35th minute, those stops sandwiched around a brilliant tip save of Braun's header in the 16th minute.

The "Boys in Blue" would finally break through in the 45th minute when Sinisa Ubiparipovic's perfect cross from the right side of the area found the head of Braun, whose header from six yards beat Sylvestre to move the scoreboard to 1-0 Indy Eleven heading into halftime.

Carolina would have the better of the chances at the start of the second half, Matt Watson's well-struck low effort in the 48th minute that missed just wide left signaling the RailHawks' intentions. Nazmi Albadawi's deflected effort almost spun over Busch for an equalizer in the 62nd minute, only to see it go a foot over the crossbar. Substitute striker Brian Shriver nearly made a quick impact in the 69th minute with a redirect at the six that took a deflection just wide right. Two minutes later it was Steven Miller's turn, his shot from the right side of the area forcing a strong, two-handed punch from Busch.

Despite Carolina's pressure it would be Indy that struck next in the 77th minute on a free kick set up minutes earlier when Simon Mensing fouled Braun on a breakaway just outside the penalty area. It was substitute midfielder Nicki Paterson stepping up to the free kick, which he bent low around the right side of the wall and inside the right post in the 76th minute to double Indy's advantage.

Indy kept its foot on the gas from there, with Braun and Don Smart seeing consecutive shots blocked by defenders inside the six in the 83rd minute. Smart would play provider on the Eleven's eventual third, his cross from the right finding Youla at the six, his redirect marking the Guinean's second of the Fall Season to put the finishing touches on a thorough win. However, Youla's night would be marred in stoppage time when he shoved Albadawi above the shoulders, drawing a straight red card.

LAST TIME vs. TBR | IND 1 : 1 TBR (SEPT. 3): Two squads in need of a win for different reasons had to settle for a share of the spoils, as Indy Eleven and the Tampa Bay Rowdies fought to a 1-1 draw in front of 9,098 fans at IUPUI's Carroll Stadium.

The two squads took a while to sort things out in attack, with Indy Eleven midfielder Duke Lacroix's 8th minute cut inside past three Rowdies ending with a blocked shot really the only truly dangerous threat of the opening minutes. Tampa Bay's Eric Avila had the visitors' first shot in the 15th minute, a swerving effort from 25 yards that Eleven goalkeeper Jon Busch blocked out for a corner at his right post.

The attacks finally started to get in sync for both sides, a set piece finish by Tampa Bay finally moving the scoreboard first in the 28th minute. Joe Cole's exquisite service from 30 yards out looked to have two options at the back right post, with a lunging Justin Chavez ending up the winner, poking his first-time shot through the legs of Busch from three yards out to give the Rowdies the lead.

However, the advantage would last only six minutes, as Indy's swarming pressure 30 yards from goal paid off, ending with Nicki Paterson nicking the ball to Omar Gordon. The Jamaican striker would take it from there, with some help from a touch by Eamon Zayed, weaving past two Rowdies defenders before finishing low past Matt Pickens to even the score at 1-1. A pair of Indy Eleven free kicks by Nemanja Vukovic would mark the best chances of the last 10 minutes of the opening half, but with both sent into the Tampa Bay wall neither threatened goal.

The second half would see Indy trying to work the flanks hard with crosses into the area, none more dangerous than Paterson's service from the left in the 62nd minute that found the head of a waiting Zayed, but the Irishman steering his shot wide left by a foot. Tampa Bay would try to find success with shots from distance, PC's effort in the 54th minute from 35 yards out testing Busch at his right post, but the veteran netminder had the chance covered all the way.

Neither goalkeeper would be forced into making a memorable save over the course of the final half hour, but that doesn't mean chances were lacking. Don Smart's run onto a Zayed ball in the 83rd minute brought the crowd to its feet, but his shot from the right side of the area would rise over frame. Indy midfielder Brad Ring would run onto no less than three loose balls outside the area in the final 10 minutes, his final attempt in the third minute of stoppage time from 25 yards trailing just left of frame to keep things square until the end.

TABLE SETTING ... BRING ON THE EDDIES: A busy Week 16 of action cleared things up for the top of the table, as New York's 4-2 win last Jacksonville on Saturday in combination with a 1-3 defeat for FC Edmonton at Minnesota allowed New York to claim the Fall Season title and the #1 seed in The Championship in November. That means that Indy Eleven will be the #2 seed in the NASL's four-team postseason tournament, while FC Edmonton has secured the #3 seed - and a date at Carroll Stadium against Indy in a November 5th Semifinal clash.

The only piece of the postseason puzzle that remains is who will earn the fourth and final berth - and that race is far from over, with six teams still in the hunt with two weeks remaining. However, Indy Eleven could very well have a big say in who will face New York in the semifinals, as the "Boys in Blue" will play Tampa Bay this Wednesday and end the season with Rayo OKC on Oct. 30.

SOULEYMANE SEES RED: One likely part of that roster rotation scenario will be unavailable on Wednesday, as forward Souleymane Youla picked up a red card in stoppage time of Indy's 3-0 win Saturday vs. Carolina. The straight red card issued to the Guinean was the fourth shown to an Indy Eleven player in Fall Season (Palmer, 7/09 v MNU; Janicki, 8/03 v JAX; Miller, 8/30 @ NY).

INJURY REPORT ... TORRADO QUESTIONABLE, JANICKI BACK: Part of the above-mentioned roster rotation will depend on Indy Eleven's injury situation, which has grown in the last two weeks with setbacks for midfielder Gerardo Torrado and defenders Cory Miller.

Torrado suffered a left calf strain on Oct. 2 at FC Edmonton, but after sitting out both games last week the Mexican international traveled with the squad to Tampa and is considered questionable for Wednesday's game against the Rowdies. Another player questionable for the Rowdies game is center back Greg Janicki, who returned to the field last Wednesday via a 15-minute cameo at the end of the scoreless draw at Jacksonville, this after he missed six games for a plantar fasciitis rupture in his right foot that kept him out since late August.

MILLER OUT FOR SEASON FOLLOWING ANKLE SURGERY: Janicki's return to the lineup and availability for selection is especially important for the Indy Eleven backline after fellow center back Cory Miller underwent season-ending surgery on Oct. 10, to repair damage in his right ankle suffered on October 2 at FC Edmonton. After gaining just one start in 10 Spring Season opportunities, Miller had filled in more than admirably during the Fall, starting 12 of the team's 17 contests in tandem with Colin Falvey or Janicki at center back.

STEPPING UP TO "THE MIKE": Dominance at home has been the overriding theme of the 2016 season for Indy Eleven, which is one of just two teams - along with New York - that is undefeated at home in 2016. The "Boys in Blue" have posted a 12W-3D-0L record and +23 goal differential (34 GF/11 GA) en route to claiming 39 of a possible 45 points at Carroll Stadium this season.

The team's home undefeated streak at Carroll Stadium actually stands at 17 games dating back to last October 10 (1-2 L vs. San Antonio), which means Indy Eleven has gone more than a full calendar year without tasting defeat at "The Mike." Should Indy and New York both stay unbeaten at home with positive results this weekend, they will equal the NASL modern era record of 18 games held by Carolina (2012-14) and New York (2014-15).

After going winless in its first 12 home games at Carroll Stadium in 2014 (0W-5D-7L), Indy Eleven has since gone 20W-7D-5L in its last 32 league outings at "The Mike," a 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 finally pulling its career home record in NASL play over the .500 mark.

DRAW STOPS AWAY AGONY: Last Wednesday's 0-0 draw in Jacksonville stopped Indy Eleven's three-game road losing streak. In contrast to its home dominance, Indy Eleven is now winless in its last 12 road contests, including a 0W-3D-6L mark during the Fall Season (which contrasts greatly with the undefeated 1W-4D-0L ledger that helped it claim the Spring Season title).

However, if the mantra to live by is "get a point on the road" then Indy Eleven's 2016 isn't all that bad, with Indiana's Team getting at least a point from majority of its 14 away affairs via a 1W-7D-6L record (10 GF/18 GA, -8 GD), the lone victory coming at Rayo OKC (2-1) on April 30. The club's career away mark is 7W-16D-19L (42 GF/70 GA), which includes one win in 15 visits to Florida (1W-8D-6L), a 2-1 win over Fort Lauderdale last on June 6, 2015.

THERE WILL BE GOALS (USUALLY): Indiana's Team had gone 18 games without a 0-0 draw - that is until last Wednesday's stalemate at Jacksonville (its last scoreless result came back on June 4 at The Miami FC). Indy has been shut out just twice in its last 15 games, while compiling five clean sheets itself in that stretch. The goal-scoring is growing as the season wears on:

Spring: 2.30 combined goals/game (15 GF/8 GA in 10 games)
Fall: 2.63 combined goals/game (29/21 in 19 games)

And if you want goals, well, they're practically guaranteed at Carroll Stadium as Indy has played 36 games since its last home 0-0 draw (Aug. 6, 2014, vs. Fort Lauderdale).

GORDON GETS CAP WITH "REGGAE BOYZ": Indy Eleven midfielder Omar Gordon earned his second appearance for Jamaica's senior national team last Tuesday in the team's 4-2 comeback win over Guyana in the Third Round of the Caribbean Futbol Union's Caribbean Cup. The recently-turned 24-year-old attacker entered early in the second half to help the "Reggae Boyz" rally from a two-goal deficit, Jamaica eventually winning after a 30-minute extra time period.

BOUNCING BACK: Indy Eleven has dealt well with adversity in 2016, as last Wednesday's 0-0 draw at Jacksonville marked the sixth time in as many opportunities the "Boys in Blue" gained at least a point following a defeat (now 4W-2D-0L in such games). The team's five-game winless streak from Aug. 20 through Sept. 10 (0W-2D-3L) was by far the longest of the 2016 season, as Indy Eleven had gone no more than two games between wins prior to the start of that streak.

On the flip side, Indy Eleven's 3-0 win over New York on Sept. 24 marked the fourth time Indy had compiled consecutive wins on the season. Indy's season-high winning streak was a three-game run in the front half of August (Aug. 3 v. JAX, Aug. 6 v. OTT & Aug. 13 v. OKC).

BRAUN IS BACK: Forward Justin Braun made up for lost time due to injury, as the Salt Lake City native has tallied three goals and two assists across the team's last six matches:

Sept. 10 at FTL - goal (93')
Sept. 17 v MIA - GW assist (Mares, 25')
Sept. 24 v NYC - GW goal (32') & assist (Mares, 51')
Oct. 15 v CAR - GW (45')

Despite missing five of six August affairs due to a right MCL sprain, Braun still sits second on the squad in goals (7) and third in assists (4).

STRIKING DIFFERENCE: Braun's recent reinsertion into the lineup is good news not just for his head coach, Tim Hankinson, but also for his strike mate up top in Indy's preferred 4-4-2 formation, Eamon Zayed. The Irishman had scored just once during an eight-game stretch that coincided with Braun's absence, and that penalty kick conversion on Aug. 20 at Carolina marked the lone goal of Zayed's 14 in NASL play that came without the industrious Braun also on the pitch. With Braun back in full stride in recent weeks Zayed has looked livelier as well, notching two assists and two goals in the last five outings.

When Braun has been on the field this season, Indy's scoring average is at 1.58 goals per 90 minutes (34 goals in 1,941 minutes) compared to a 1.33 per 90 minutes clip without him (10 goals in 679 minutes).

EAMON ZAYED GIVETH ... The “Boys in Blue” have been getting scoresheet contributions from across the field, with 11 different players recording assists on goals tallied by 12 players.

Eamon Zayed has gone on an assist binge with 4 helpers in his last 9 games - the latest on Justin Braun's GWG goal on Sept. 24 vs. New York temporarily giving him the sole share of the team lead in the category with six. However, Dylan Mares' supply of Zayed's last two tallies against New York and FC Edmonton moved him into a share of the lead on six assists, the duo pacing ahead of Braun by two. The six assists for Mares and Zayed have set a new single-season club record in the category, which Mares set last year with five.

While that trio leads the pack, Nicki Paterson and Nemanja Vukovic are the only players on the squad to notch two assists in a game this season (Paterson on July 13 vs. FTL, Vukovic on June 11 vs. CAR), and each have three helpers on the season to date along with Don Smart.

Mares' latest assists also padded his lead in the career category for Indiana's Team ...

DIAMONDS ARE FOREVER?: Head coach Tim Hankinson had seen the signs of Indy Eleven's attack growing stale during a recent five-game winless streak ... so the Indy Eleven gaffer did something about it, switching his midfield formation from a somewhat “flat four” to a diamond in advance of its meeting with Miami FC on Sept. 17. In the five games since then Indy Eleven's attack has shown some punch, scoring multiple goals in wins over Miami (2-1), New York (3-0) and Carolina (3-0), showing the switch might have been what the “Boys in Blue” needed ...

SIGNS FROM SINISA: ... but the formation change in midfield was only half about shape - it was also an effort to get playmaker Sinisa Ubiparipovic back on the field and in a spot that plays to his strengths. During Indy Eleven's first 14 Fall Season contests, “Ubi” saw just 16 minutes of action (July 30 at Miami), but the 33-year-old midfielder has started the last five games - his first starts since May 14 - atop the midfield diamond, helping dictate play from the middle of the park and diversify what had become an increasingly flank-dependent attack. Sinisa's been finding his stride, getting “hockey assists” in back-to-back games against New York and FC Edmonton and notching an actual assist last Saturday on his inch-perfect cross to Justin Braun for the GWG against Carolina. After fighting nagging hip and knee injuries early on, Ubiparipovic has one assist in 667 minutes of action this season (11 GP, 9 GS, 10 chances created).

ELEVEN (NOT ALWAYS) LEAVING IT LATE: With two more late tallies last Saturday against Carolina, Indy Eleven now has 14 goals past the 75th minute, even with New York's haul for the most in the league during "winning time." While late-game drama was Indy Eleven's "M-O" in the first half of the year, the late goals have somewhat dried up, as the Boys in Blue have scored 39% of their goals in league play (17 of 44) – and earned 21 of 49 standings points and a little thing called the Spring Season title – courtesy of finishes past the 70th minute of games.

With Indy Eleven's fevered fights to the finish, the last 15-minute (plus stoppage time) stretch has been the most active with 19 goals scored (14 GF/5 GA).

The five-goal output on Aug. 3 vs. JAX marked the most goals for Indy in a regular season game in its now 86-game history.

DEFENSE RIGHTING THE SHIP: Indy Eleven's stability towards the top of the NASL table has come largely part to its defense. Indy Eleven allowed just one goal or less in 12 of its first 13 contests, and while the "Boys in Blue" have allowed multiple tallies seven times in its last 16 outings, they also notched their third clean sheet in the last four games Saturday against Carolina.

Indy Eleven's 29 goals conceded are tied with New York for the second fewest across the NASL's Combined Season, behind only the ridiculous pace being set by Edmonton (20). Saturday's shutout was Indy's - and goalkeeper Jon Busch's - 10th of the season, tied the third most in the league for clubs and goalkeepers, respectively.

DEFENDERS FINISHING THE JOB: Center back Greg Janicki continued his set piece mastery on Aug. 20, his finish of Dylan Mares' spot-on corner kick service giving the veteran his fourth goal of 2016. Indy's surprising haul of eight goals from its defensive unit (Janicki 4, Nemanja Vukovic 3 & Colin Falvey 1) has helped the squad diversify its scoring portfolio.

AT THE "BIG 4-0," BUSCH LEADS EXPERIENCED SQUAD: The common thread with Indy Eleven's batch of 14 newcomers in 2016 can be summed up in one word – experience. Eleven of the 14 new "Boys in Blue" are at least 30 years of age, while two of the other three – Neil Shaffer (27) and Justin Braun (29) – have served as captain at their previous stop. With the additions of Gerardo Torrado (37) and Souleymane Youla (34) in June, Indy Eleven now boasts the most experienced roster in the NASL. Goalkeeper Jon Busch, now in his 20th professional season in American soccer circles, serves as the oldest of the group now at 40 years of age after celebrating his birthday on Aug. 18, while second-year forward Duke Lacroix is the youngster at 22 (but not for long ... he turned 23 last Friday).

EVERY POINT ADDS TO INDY'S NEW RECORD: It may be a sign of the struggles of the first two seasons or of the marked improvement in year three (or both), but whatever you want to chalk it up to there's no arguing that Indy Eleven set a new single-season points record just 18 games into its 2016 campaign, eclipsing its previous high of 33 with a 2-1 win over Rayo OKC on Aug. 13 that landed Indiana's Team on 34 points

VUKOVIC LEADS "IRONMAN" RACE: When it comes to consistency, head coach Tim Hankinson has been able to lean on a steady stable of formidable veterans to log big minutes in 2016. A handful of members of the team's "Over-30 Gang," led by left back Nemanja Vukovic, are at the top of the team's "Ironman" categories of games played, games started and minutes played ... and the new, lone member of the team's "Over-40 Gang," Jon Busch (who turned the big 4-0 on August 18) ain't far behind. After coming out of the team's season opener with 17 minutes left due to a knock, the 32-year-old Vukovic has played every minute of the squad's last 28 contests.

TORRADO TAKES THE PITCH: Newcomer Gerardo Torrado settled into his new role middle of the Indy Eleven midfield, starting 10 of his first 13 available games (and coming off the bench in the other three) up until a recent calf injury sidelined him for Indy Eleven's last two outings. When healthy, the 37-year-old has displayed the organizing, passing and tackling abilities that made him one of the most impactful signings in the NASL's modern era. A notable moment for the league came on Aug. 20, when Torrado lined up against longtime "El Tri" teammate Omar Bravo for all 90 minutes against Carolina at WakeMed Soccer Park.

The June 8 signing of Torrado was a landmark one for the NASL and Indy Eleven, as the midfielder's credentials include being the second-most capped player in Mexican National Team history (162), 11 games played across three FIFA World Cup appearances (2002, 2006 & 2010) and an 11-year stint with Mexican club powerhouse Cruz Azul – the last 10 of which he served as captain.

"El Borrego" was ineligible for league play until the transfer window opened on July 4, and a visit to Mexico to sort out visa paperwork left him unavailable for games on July 9 (vs. MNU) and July 13 (vs. FTL). He made his unofficial debut on June 26 with a 62-minute runout against Liga MX champs Pachuca in an international friendly at Carroll Stadium. Torrado's NASL debut came via an impressive second half performance on July 16 at Minnesota.

ZAYED WEARING TWO HATS: Eamon Zayed became the first Indy Eleven player to score multiple goals in 2016 with his brace against New York on April 16, but the Irish-born, Libyan international one-upped himself on June 11 by scoring the first hat trick for the “Boys in Blue” in NASL play. Not one to settle, the man who earned the “Mr. Hat Trick” moniker during his days in Iran registered a second three-goal effort of the season on August 3 against Jacksonville, giving him two of the NASL’s three hat trick to this point in 2016 (MNU’s Christian Ramirez on July 2 vs. CAR was the other).

While Wojciech Wojcik tallied thrice in preseason play against Arizona United back in March and Blake Smith did the deed in U.S. Open Cup play in 2014 against the Dayton Dutch Lions, Zayed became the first to do the honor against NASL competition in the team’s 67th league game. Zayed became the fifth member of the “Boys in Blue” to tally a brace in regular season play – and is the only one on that list currently on the roster:

“MIRACLE AT THE MIKE” GIVES INDY SPRING TITLE: Dramatic three-goal wins are few and far between, but Indy Eleven’s memorable 4-1 triumph over Carolina on June 11 gave Indy the three standings points, four goals and three-goal winning margin it needed to surpass the New York Cosmos at the top of the table and earn the NASL’s Spring title – and The Championship automatic berth in November that comes along with it. Indy Eleven collected the Spring Season trophy from NASL Commissioner Bill Peterson prior to last Saturday’s 1-0 win over Minnesota at Carroll Stadium, and the NASL is expected to announce the date and time of Indy’s first-ever appearance in The Championship, set to take place the weekend of Nov. 4-6, in the coming weeks. The surprise result at “The Mike” included the club’s first-ever hat trick in NASL play by Eamon Zayed (15’, 65’ 85’) and Justin Braun’s third goal in four league matches to close out a memorable Spring.

START WITH A STREAK: A 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 allowed Indy Eleven to re-write the NASL record book, its 13th straight game without a defeat to start the season (6W-7D-0L) equaling the longest regular season undefeated streak in the league’s modern history alongside the 2011 Carolina RailHawks and 2013-14 New York Cosmos. The “Boys in Blue” saw that run halted three days later with its 0-2 loss at Minnesota United FC.

If you want to get picky, Indy Eleven actually went 15 competitive games without a defeat to start 2016 when counting its two Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup contests (even its penalty kick defeat at the Chicago Fire in the Fourth Round technically went down as a 1-1 draw). While it doesn’t count officially, if you want to throw the team’s 1-0 exhibition win over Liga MX champion C.F. Pachuca onto the compilation as well, we won’t stop you.

HANKINSON AT THE HELM: Indy Eleven’s offseason began in earnest on December 2, when veteran coach Tim Hankinson was named the second full-time head coach of “Indiana’s Team.” Indy Eleven is the latest stop on a now 36-year coaching journey that has seen Hankinson lead teams at nearly every level of the sport in the United States – including two years in the North American Soccer League and nine years in Major League Soccer – and taken him across the globe.

The native of New York City is familiar with the NASL after being named the first head coach of the San Antonio Scorpions in 2012, helping the expansion squad to the league’s regular season championship in his first season. Hankinson is now 32W-20D-21L in 73 regular season games in the NASL, the first 44 of which came with San Antonio from 2012-13 (19W-10D-15L).

“WOJ” ON LOAN: Forward Wojciech Wojcik recently completed his lengthy loan stint with OKC Energy FC, although since he remained with the USL side past the NASL’s roster-freeze date, the 24-year-old striker will not be eligible to suit up for Indy Eleven again in 2016. “Woj” was one of Energy FC’s co-leading scorers with four goals in 23 regular season appearances (1,334 minutes) and also made two appearances (23 minutes total) in OKC’s pair of USL playoff games. Wojcik made one appearance off the bench for Indy in 2016 against New York during the Spring Season, this after he started 13 of 21 games during his first year with the club.

INDY UPSETS LIGA MX CHAMP PACHUCA IN FRIENDLY: Indy Eleven used an early tally by striker Eamon Zayed, a fantastic goalkeeping display by Keith Cardona and plenty of last-ditch defending to down recently-crowned Liga MX Clausura season champion C.F. Pachuca 1-0 in an international friendly June 26. It was Zayed putting Indy up just seven minutes in with an opportunistic goal, collecting a clumsily played ball by the Tuzos’ center backs and before slotting low and left of Alfonso Blanco to put the home side up 1-0. Another poor back pass by Pachuca sprung Zayed on goal in the 26th minute, but the Irishman hurried his chip past an onrushing Blanco, missing just left of the frame to keep things close. Cardona got the full shift between the posts, and he came up big on a handful of occasions, most notably a kick save on Erick Sanchez’s 15-yard blast in the 82nd minute.

INDY KNOCKED OUT OF OPEN CUP BY – CHICAGO IN PKs: Indy Eleven took a Major League Soccer squad into added extra time of a Fourth Round Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup tie for the second time in three seasons, but would ultimately bow out to Chicago Fire SC 3-4 in penalty kicks following a 1-1 draw after the extra 30 minute session at Toyota Park on June 15.

It was the “Men in Red” enjoying the best chances through the scoreless 90 minutes of regulation, but Chicago’s speedy attackers were missing the final touch when they weren’t testing Indy goalkeeper Jon Busch, who made 7 stops on the night. At the end of the first 15 minute session of added extra time Justin Braun would put the visitors on top with a splendid left-footed finish, giving Indy’s sizeable traveling contingent hope of advancing to the Round of 16. However, after missing several good looks throughout, Ghanaian striker David Accam would finally hit home for Fire SC, dekeing two defenders before finishing far post past Busch in the 111th minute, setting the stage for PKs.

Indy Eleven would go up 2-0 initially in penalties thanks to makes by Nicki Paterson and Eamon Zayed and a first chance miss from Kennedy Igboananike. However, Chicago ‘keeper Matt Lampson would save Indy’s next chances by Nemanja Vukovic and Daniel Keller, and Accam would polish off the fourth and final kick for Chicago to push the MLS’ers through to the Round of 16.

OFFSEASON MAKEOVER: Indy Eleven named American coaching veteran Tim Hankinson as the club’s second permanent head coach on Dec. 2, and changes to the roster of “Indiana’s Team” would be soon to follow. The roster to begin the season was split nearly down the middle between returning players (10) and newcomers (12) – a trend that carried over to Hankinson’s coaching staff thanks to the return of Tim Regan to an assistant role and the addition of veteran goalkeeper Jon Busch, who will serve as the squad’s goalkeeping coach in addition to the team’s first-choice netminder. With the late-Spring Season addition of Gerardo Torrado and Souleymane Youla and recent departure of Gorka Larrea, the roster now includes 13 new “Boys in Blue” ...
