CARY, N.C. — North Carolina FC (9W-9D-9L, 36 points third place) continues its push to qualify for the 2017 NASL playoffs, as it welcomes the Indy Eleven (6W-10D-9L, 28 points, sixth place) today. The match is presented by Dogtopia.

With just five matches left in the NASL Fall Season, North Carolina needs points to stay in front of the competition and ensure its spot in the postseason.

NCFC enters the week in third place in the combined league standings and three points ahead of fourth-place New York Cosmos and fifth-place Jacksonville Armada FC who both have 33 points. Another victory will see NCFC hold on to its lead over its league rivals and move another week closer to capturing a spot in the playoffs.

The club will take on an Indy Eleven side that has caused problems for NCFC this season. The visitors have stolen all nine points from the series in 2017, most recently earning a 1-0 victory with a stoppage-time winner on Sept. 13. However, Indy is coming off a busy week that included a midweek visit to Jacksonville Armada FC on Sept. 27 just five days before the match tonight.

Last Time Out:

NCFC is coming off a massive 2-0 win over the New York Cosmos. The team scored first-half goals via Renan Gorne and Austin da Luz, while Brian Sylvestre recorded his third shutout in four matches with another solid performance between the sticks.

Players to Watch:

No. 31 Steven Miller

The right back, most recently turned midfielder is a flexible piece in the team's lineup. Miller has shown his ability to get up the flanks and into the attack, recording two goals and three assists this season. Look for Miller to work along the right flank and find space in the attack, as well as serve as a reliable defensive option.

No. 19 Ben Speas

Speas is an attacking midfielder with the ability to score as well as provide service for teammates to score. The midfielder spends most of his time in the opponent's half. With four goals and four assists to his name this season, Speas is another dangerous attacking option for Indy that will look to create problems for the NCFC backline.

The North American Soccer League (NASL) announced Friday that Puerto Rico FC's upcoming home game against North Carolina FC on Saturday, October 7, has been moved to Sahlen's Stadium at WakeMed Soccer Park in Cary. Kickoff will remain at 7:30 p.m. ET.

Puerto Rico was scheduled to host NCFC at Juan Ramón Loubriel Stadium in Bayamón, but the destruction caused by Hurricane Maria left the league with no choice but to move the game elsewhere.

Since the matchup was slated to be a home game for Puerto Rico, all tickets will be only \$10 and 50% of all ticket sales will go to the hurricane relief fund that was set up by Puerto Rico FC owner Carmelo Anthony. NASL Vet

Albadawi Heating Up

After just one league goal in the Spring Season, Nazmi Albadawi has scored twice in last four matches. His goal against FC Edmonton earned him the NASL Play of the Week Honor. He also recently added an assist in a 2-0 victory over New York on Sep. 23.

Tiyi Closes In

Good Fortune

Dre Fortune continued to add to his promising first season with NCFC. The midfielder has scored twice and picked up two assists. He most recently added an assist in NCFC's 3-0 win over FC Edmonton on Sep. 10.

Acosta Selected to U.S. YNT for U17 World Cup

George Acosta will represent the United States at the U17 World Cup in October in India. The young star played the final part of the PDL season with NCFC U23 and earned playing time in the first team's exhibition against Swansea City.

NCFC Youth Academy, NC Courage Academy Begin Seasons

This season, 14 youth teams representing North Carolina Football Club have begun their respective seasons in the U.S. Soccer Developmental Academy. 10 with NCFC Youth and four with the NC Courage are playing in the first season since NCFC's historic collaboration with CASL and Triangle Futbol Club Alliance.

Reynares Returns from Tampa Bay Loan

For the third time this season, Matias Reynares was sent to the Tampa Bay Rowdies (USL) on Ioan. Reynares returned on Aug. 20.

Carranza Goes Pro

North Carolina FC has locked down the services of midfielder Jose Carranza, signing the teenager to his first professional contract after his breakout Spring Season. The United States U18 National Team member provided a spark for NCFC late in the Spring Season. He recorded a game-winning assist on July 4 against Spring Season Champions Miami FC, and his play earned him NASL Team of the Week honors on July 6. Carranza has totaled six appearances and three starts, while playing 308 minutes.

Glenn Debuts Then Scores

Jonathan Glenn made his debut for North Carolina FC against Puerto Rico FC on July 29 after training with the team just twice. He came in at halftime and had great holdup play, causing problems for PRFC defenders during his entire 45 minutes on the field.

In the following game, the attacker made his first start and scored his first goal for the club.

NCFC Trades Shriver for Two Armada Players

In an effort to add strength and depth to its midfield and forward positions, North Carolina FC has traded veteran forward Brian Shriver to Jacksonville Armada FC in exchange for forward Jonathan Glenn and midfielder Danny Barrow.

Barrow spent the last season and a half as a reserve midfielder for Jacksonville. The young winger hails from Braunton, England, and came up through the Welsh Youth National Team system.

Glenn, a native of Trinidad and Tobago, joins NCFC after playing the Spring Season as Jacksonville's No. 9. The striker started seven matches and logged one goal. Prior to his stint in Jacksonville, The Trinidadian played for Breiðablik and IBV in Iceland from 2014-16 where he tallied 25 goals during three seasons. Glenn has also appeared in six matches for the Trinidad and Tobago National Team and helped lead his country to the Caribbean Cup final in 2014.

Former Academy Standout D.J. Taylor Returns Home

North Carolina FC has signed former Capital Area RailHawks Academy member D.J. Taylor to a professional contract for the remainder of the 2017 NASL season. Taylor becomes just the second former Academy member to sign a professional contract with the first team, joining Dre Fortune.

The right back is a Raleigh, N.C., native and played in the academy system from 2012-15. Taylor also earned time with the United States U-18 National Team in 2015. Following his academy career, Taylor signed an amateur contract with NCFC in May of 2015. Following a short stint with NCFC, Taylor moved to Spain, where he played with FC Torre Levante of the Tercera Division the last two seasons.

NCFC Draws with Swansea City

North Carolina FC used impressive performances from Brian Sylvestre, Macklin Robinson and Matias Reynares to keep the cleansheet against EPL side Swansea City. All three keepers made big saves, while Dre Fortune and Jon Orlando had chances in the box saved away.

MLS Visits NCFC

Major League Soccer President and Deputy Commissioner Mark Abbott visited the Triangle on Wednesday, July 19, as part of the league's tour of the 12 markets vying for MLS Expansion. Initial renderings for the proposed stadium design were released at the press conference. A rally was held afterwards where hundreds of fans showed their support for the New State of Soccer.

NCFC vs. The EPL

Following a 0-0 draw with Swansea City on July 22, North Carolina FC owns a 0W-2D-0L record against EPL clubs. In 2016, the club drew 2-2 with West Ham United.

Youth Movement

North Carolina has turned to its young talent as of late, getting contributions from two of the youngest members on the squad. Jose Carranza provided an assist on the game-winning goal on 7/4/2017 against Miami, while Dre Fortune scored his first NASL goal on 7/7/2017 at Edmonton.

M. Robinson Returns from Loan

Macklin Robinson was loaned to the Pittsburgh Riverhounds (USL) on July 1st. After starting for the Riverhounds in its July 4th match against the Charlotte Independence, Robinson is back with NCFC.

Spoiled

Miami FC needed a win to clinch the Spring Season title when the two teams met on July 4. It was NCFC who celebrated after the match, earning a 1-0 win to delay Miami's celebrations for another week.

From 1 to 100

On 6/17/2017 at Indy, NCFC captain Nazmi Albdawi earned his 100th competitive cap. In the 73rd minute, Dre Fortune, the first former NCFC Youth Academy player in North Carolina FC's history to sign a professional contract with the first team, made his NASL debut and second overall competitive appearance for the club.

Club 100

Austin da Luz (118), Nazmi Albadawi (114) and Connor Tobin (108) all joined Tiyi Shipalane (165), as current members of NCFC's century club.

Getting Back Numbers

NCFC got over a tough injury bug during the spring season. The club saw defenders Steven Miller, Paul Black and Connor Tobin as well as defensive midfielder James Marcelin all miss time due to injury.

A Top Playmaker

Billy Schuler earned national attention for his goal against the New York Cosmos on 6/10/2017. His one-touch volley from outside the box flew into the net and was the No. 1 play on #SCTop10 and was also featured as the NASL Play of the Week.

The attacker turned heads again with a gamewinning goal against Miami FC on July 4. His play earned him the NASL Play of the Week for the third time this season.

Thinking Outside the Box

NCFC is a constant threat with the ball anywhere in the attacking half. The team's long-range scoring abilities have been prominently displayed over the Spring Season. The club has totaled 10 goals from outside the box this season.

A Scoring Chance

Captain Nazmi Albadawi is second in the NASL in chances created. The local talent leads the team with 48 chances created on the season. He's scored five times across all competitions.

NASL Team of the Month

Brian Sylvestre, Lance Laing and Billy Schuler all earned a spot on the NASL Team of the Month for May after impressive performances helped NCFC move into the top half of the standings.

Taking a Shot

NCFC continues to prove itself as a scoring threat

from multiple players. The team ranks third in the NASL in shots taken with 320, and is third with 36 goals. Lance Laing and Matt Fondy both rank among the league leaders in total shots taken.

Providing Clearance

Connor Tobin has been a staple of the NCFC defense. The veteran ranks second in the NASL in total clearances with 130.

Ruhaak Learns Quick

NCFC signed defender Brad Ruhaak to his first professional contract on May 23. The defender came to NCFC from college soccer powerhouse, the University of Akron. Ruhaak has been called on right away, playing at right back and center back.

Scoring Early and Often

Fans haven't had to wait long for NCFC to score a goal. The team has scored 12 goals in the first 30 minutes of play this season. In a trend that has lasted all season, Renan Gorne was the latest player to score early with a goal against FC Edmonton in the 22nd minute.

Career Revival

After just one goal in 19 appearances in 2016 for Lance Laing with Minnesota United, a change of scenery was exactly what he needed. The Jamaican has scored eight goals and recorded four assists in 2017. The combined scoring and assist numbers rank third in the NASL, and Laing also ranks first the league in total crosses with 157. The free-kick specialist is deadly anywhere close to the box. Laing has scored three times this season from free kicks.

Protecting the Net

Brian Sylvestre is having a breakout season between the posts. He leads the NASL with 95 saves.

From Super Sub to Starter

After scoring four goals in four appearances as a substitute, Billy Schuler has emerged as a starter on NCFC's attacking line. The forward has scored four goals and added one assist in 13 league appearances.

Open Cup Season

NCFC opened its Open Cup season with a 6-1 route of the PDL's Carolina Dynamo. The team scored three goals in each half, as Billy Schuler (2), Brian Shriver, Jon Orlando, Tiyi Shipalane and Matt Fondy all found the back of the net.

Additionally, Macklin Robinson, Marcel Kandziora and Dre Fortune all made their first start for NCFC.

NCFC continued its Open Cup season with a 4-1 victory over the Charlotte Independence. James Marcelin recorded his first Open Cup goal on the only score of the first half. Connor Tobin also scored his first goal of the season, adding to a Nazmi Albadawi second-half brace.

The win against Charlotte clinched a match with the Houston Dynamo, marking the fifth time in six years that NCFC has hosted a MLS team. The match against the Dynamo was a toe-to-toe affair with neither team able to pull away from the other after 90 minutes. After NCFC's extra-time chance was denied, Houston took the lead in the 109th minute and held on for the win.

The club finished its Open Cup season with a 2-1 record, while outscoring its opponents 12-5.

Carranza, del Rosario, Perez Represent U.S U18

Jose Carranza and NCFC Youth Academy products Manny Perez and Lucas del Rosario are becoming key pieces for the U.S. U18 youth national team. The trio led the U.S. U18 team to a second-place finish in the Slovakia Cup on April 28.

All three were called back to the U18 camp from June 8-19 in Lisbon, Portugal for the Lisbon International Tournament.

U16/18 Academies Complete Seasons at the Developmental Academy Playoffs

Both the U16 and U18 Ćapital Area RailHawks Academy teams competed in the U.S. Soccer Developmental Academy Playoffs. The competition featured the best academies in the nation. NCFC's Academy was one of 21 to place teams in the playoffs for both age groups. The U16 team finished the season with a 18W-8L-7D record, while the U18's finished 20W-7L-6D.

Sahlen's Stadium at WakeMed Soccer Park

The North Carolina Football Club, along with the Town of Cary, announced a new sponsorship deal with Sahlen Packing Company on March 31. As part of the deal, the main stadium at WakeMed Soccer Park was renamed Sahlen's Stadium. Additionally, Sahlen's is the exclusive hot dog provider to the stadium.

The Sahlen family owned the 2016 NWSL Champion Western New York Flash, which was acquired by the North Carolina Football Club in January of 2017 and subsequently re-branded as the North Carolina Courage. On April 29, the club honored the Sahlen family with a pre-game ceremony highlighting their championship season and contribution to the sport.

CASL and TFCA Enters a Historic Strategic Collaboration with North Carolina Football Club

In early March, North Carolina Football Club announced that it entered a historic collaboration with the Capital Area Soccer League (CASL) and Triangle Futbol Club Alliance (TFCA), resulting in the largest youth-to-professional soccer club in the United States. CASL and TFCA rebranded as North Carolina FC Youth beginning this season, and will complete the transition this summer. North Carolina FC Youth will take the field in the fall wearing the NCFC crest on their jerseys.

A combined 61 years of soccer management, coaching and on-field success between CASL and TFCA will ensure North Carolina FC Youth will offer the

best player development and training opportunities to players of all ages and abilities. The combined resources will allow soccer to grow in our area by attracting talented coaches and players, providing a clear pathway to professional soccer, and fostering a sense of connection between youth soccer and the professional team among many other benefits.

Offseason signings

During the offseason, North Carolina Football Club President and General Manager, Curt Johnson, was busy bringing new key pieces to the club. North Carolina FC signed Saeed Robinson, Alex Molano, Christian Ibeagha, Marcel Kandziora, Bolu Akinyode, Lance Laing, Dre Fortune, Matias Reynares, George Marks, and Jose Carranza.

Robinson, Molano, Kandziora, Akinyode, Laing and Fortune are all midfielders who are expected to make a huge influence on the field for North Carolina FC.

Laing, a former member of FC Edmonton and the Fort Lauderdale Strikers, is the first NASL player to be named to the NASL's Best XI three times, while Fortune is the first Capital Area RailHawks Development Academy player in the organization's history to sign a professional contract with the first team.

Molano is a versatile midfielder who appeared in 17 regular season games for the Swope Park Rangers of the United Soccer League in 2016. The 24-year-old led North Carolina FC in the preseason, with three goals in five games.

Robinson and Akinyode spent the 2016 season playing in the USL for the Colorado Springs Switchbacks and Bethlehem Steel FC, respectively. Kandziora is a German international who has experience with various teams in the German 2. Bundesliga.

lbeagha is a former Duke Blue Devil who played with Robinson last season with the Colorado Switchbacks. The 6-foot-2 Nigeria native appeared in 30 games as a defender, contributing one assist and amassing 2,656 minutes.

Reynares is an 18-year-old goalkeeper who signed his first professional contract with the Fort Lauderdale Strikers last year for the 2016 season. Reynares split time with the first team as Bruno Cardoso's backup and with the Strikers' NPSL squad.

Marks is a 17-year-old Raleigh native that is a product of the Capital Area RailHawks Academy. The goalkeeper worked his way through the CASL system, until he reached the U-15/16 Capital Area RailHawks team in 2015. Since then, he has started 30 games for the U-15/16 and U-17/18 teams.

In December, Owner Steve Malik and President and General Manager Curt Johnson ushered in a New State of Soccer by announcing several initiatives bolstered by a bold new brand with a modern vision for soccer in the Triangle and North Carolina. The initiatives center around bringing the highest level of men's and women's professional soccer in North America to the Triangle.

In conjunction with the brand repositioning, the Carolina RailHawks were renamed North Carolina FC (referred to as NCFC), and received a new crest and colors. Malik also grew the North Carolina Football Club family by bringing the Triangle an NWSL team, the North Carolina Courage, in January.

NORTH CAROLINA FC HEAD COACH COLIN CLARKE

Colin Clarke enters his sixth season as head coach of the North Carolina FC after being appointed to the position on December 6, 2011. Clarke signed a new multi-year contract with the organization on 2014. This contract makes Colin Clarke the longest tenured head coach in franchise history.

Prior to joining the organization for the 2012 NASL Season, Clarke enjoyed successful seasons with league rival the Puerto Rico Islanders and FC Dallas of Major League Soccer. After a successful professional and international playing career, Clarke was hired to his first head coaching job with the Richmond Kickers by then Kickers General Manager and current North Carolina FC President Curt Johnson in 1998. In his first season, Clarke led the organization to a fourth place league finish accompanied by a run to the NASL Semifinals and a historic run in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup highlighted by a victory over the 2011 and 2012 MLS Champion, LA Galaxy.

In the newly formatted 2013 NASL Regular Season, Clarke led the team to accumulate the most points over the Spring Season and Fall Season with an overall record of 12 wins, 7 ties, and 7 losses in league play. In 2013, Clarke and the team once again defeated the LA Galaxy in the Third Round of the U.S. Open Cup and avenged their Fourth Round loss in 2012 with a 3-1 victory over Chivas USA. The trip to the Quarterfinals of the 100th Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup was NCFC's longest run in the annual tournament since their Semifinal run in 2007.

Over his two seasons in charge, Clarke led the Kickers to a 38 - 18 record. During the 2003 Major League Soccer season, Clarke took over as head coach of the Dallas Burn (later named FC Dallas) and turned around the club's fortunes, leading the club to a Western Conference first place finish in 2006. In 2007, Clarke joined the Puerto Rico Islanders. His tenure in Puerto Rico was highlighted by a league regular season championship in 2008 and a historic run to the semifinals of the 2008-2009 CONCACAF Champions League before losing to Cruz Azul in a penalty kick shootout. For his accomplishments over the course of the 2008 season, Clarke was named the league's Coach of the Year. In 2010, Clarke's Islanders made headlines in Champions League play once again when they defeated the LA Galaxy 4 — 1 at the Home Depot Center. Following their Champions League success, the Islanders went on to defeat NCFC in the USSF-D2 Pro League Championship Final. Clarke left his tenure with the Islanders with a league regular season championship (2008), a league championship (2010), two CFU Club Championships (2010, 2011), and five consecutive playoff berths (2007-2011).

Prior to coaching, Clarke established himself as one of the top players from Northern Ireland representing the country in the 1986 World Cup and experiencing a twelve-year playing career in England. Clarke began his playing career with Peterborough United of the Football League Fourth Division in 1981 and quickly ascended to England's First Division spending time with Southampton, Queens Park Rangers, and Portsmouth until a knee injury ended his playing career. Appearing 38 times for the Northern Ireland National Team, Clarke recorded a World Cup goal, a hat-trick, and finished his career as the all-time leading goal scorer for Northern Ireland (13). Clarke finished his professional career with 147 goals in 436 matches.
