Match Preview:

North Carolina FC (4W-3D-4L, 15 pts, 5th place) will have to move on quickly from its Open Cup clash with the Houston Dynamo, as the team resumes NASL play with a trip to Michael A. Carroll Stadium in Indianapolis for a matchup with the Indy Eleven (0W-7D-4L, 7 pts, 8th place) on Saturday at 7:30 p.m.

Points are on the table, as North Carolina FC can jump to third place with a win against the Eleven. The team has performed well on the road this season, taking points from four out of six road matches, most recently earning a 2-2 draw against the New York Cosmos on June 10th.

The meeting between the two teams is the first of 2017. Indy went undefeated with six-consecutive draws to open the season, but the team has struggled of late, losing four of its last five league matches.

North Carolina FC will look to its consistent attack, which has recorded 16 goals this season. The goals rank second in the league this year, just one shy of Miami FC, who currently tops the NASL table. The team will also look to shore up its defense effort, as Paul Black is expected to resume NASL play after an injury kept him sidelined the last six matches.

Last Time Out:

NCFC fell in a heartbreaker to the Houston Dynamo on Wednesday, June 14, as the MLS side clinched a 3-2 win in the 109th minute with a goal from Memo Rodriguez. A back and forth game saw Steven Miller and Lance Laing each score a goal for NCFC.

Players to Watch:

#7 Lance Laing

Laing goes into this weekend's matchup in great form for NCFC. The midfielder from Jamaica has scored two set-piece goals in the past two games for NCFC, pushing his goal tally to 6 goals in 2017, with five coming from NASL play and one in the Open Cup.

#32 Colin Falvey

Falvey, a 6'1" center defender from Cork City, Ireland, has captained the Indy Eleven for all of his nine appearances this season. He has been named to the NASL Team of the Week twice this season, along with being selected for the NASL Team of the Month for his impressive games in May. He has won 56 duels, 30 tackles, and intercepted 25 passes this season for Indy Eleven.

Black is Back:

After missing six matches (4 NASL & 2 Open Cup) due to injury, Paul Black played his first match in more than month and went 120 minutes against the Houston Dynamo.

A Top Play:

Billy Schuler earned national attention for his goal against the New York Cosmos. His one-touch volley from outside the box flew into the net and was the No. 1 play on #SCTop10 and was also featured as the NASL Play of the Week. His play also earned his spot on the NASL Team of the Week for Week 12.

Thinking Outside the Box:

NCFC is a constant threat with the ball anywhere in the attacking half. The team's long-range scoring abilities have been prominently displayed over the last few matches. It's last five goals have all come from strikes outside the box. Steven Miller and Lance Laing stuck from distance against Houston, while Laing and Billy Schuler found of the back of the net against the Cosmos in its last league match and center back Connor Tobin even produced a screamer against the Charlotte Independence. The club has totaled nine goals from outside the box this season.

A Scoring Chance:

Captain Nazmi Albadawi ranks top five in the NASL in chances created. The local talent leads the team with 15 chances created on the season. He's scored three times across all competitions.

NASL Team of the Month:

Brian Sylvestre, Lance Laing and Billy Schuler all earned a spot on the NASL Team of the Month for May after impressive performances helped NCFC move into the top half of the standings.

Taking a Shot:

NCFC continues to prove itself as a scoring threat from multiple players. The team ranks fifth in the NASL in shots taken with 117, but second with 16 goals. Lance Laing and Matt Fondy both rank among the league leaders in total shots taken.

Providing Clearance:

Connor Tobin has been a staple of the NCFC defense. The veteran ranks fourth in the NASL in total clearances with 48.

Ruhaak Learns Quick:

NCFC signed defender Brad Ruahaak to his first professional contract on May 23. The defender came to NCFC from college soccer powerhouse, the University of Akron. Ruhaak has been called on right away, playing at right back and center back. He's earned three starts and made four appearances, while playing 317 minutes across all competitions this season.

Getting Forward:

After 11 matches this season, NCFC is second in the NASL with 16 goals. Seven players have found the back of the net this season, while Lance Laing leads the team with five goals.

Scoring Early and Often:

Fans haven't had to wait long for NCFC to score a goal. The team has scored seven goals in the first 30 minutes of play this season. Matt Fondy opened the scoring against Miami FC in the NASL opener in the fourth minute. In the team's second home match of the season, Lance Laing opened the scoring in the fourth minute with a gorgeous free-kick and Nazmi Albadawi added another goal in the 23rd minute. The trend continued with a win over Jacksonville as James Marcelin scored NCFC's first goal in the 27th minute of play. Marcelin continued his trend of early goals in the U.S. Open Cup, finding the back of the net in the 17th minute of a derby win over the Charlotte Independence. Most recently, Billy Schuler and Steven Miller scored screamers in the first 10 minutes of play in the team's last two matches.

Career Revival:

After just one goal in 19 appearances in 2016 for Lance Laing with Minnesota United, a change of scenery was exactly what he needed. The Jamaican has scored six goals and recorded three assists in 2017. The combined scoring and assist numbers lead the NASL, while he is second in the league in scoring and at the top of the league in assists. Laing also leads the NASL in total crosses with 68. The free-kick specialist is deadly anywhere close to the box. Laing has scored three times and twice in the last two matches from free kicks.

Protecting the Net:

Brian Sylvestre is having a breakout season between the posts. He leads the NASL with 50 saves. His eight saves against Miami FC secured a point on the road and earned him NASL Player of the Week honors as well as a spot on the NASL Team of the Week. Sylvestre followed up his performance at Miami with a shutout at Puerto Rico FC for his first clean sheet of the year and another NASL Team of the Week selection. Sylvestre has faced less shots in the last few weeks, but he is maintaining his fine form and making quality saves when tested.

Super Sub:

Billy Schuler has been the definition of a super sub. The forward has scored five goals in eight appearances, while four of his goals have come as a substitute.

Open Cup Season:

NCFC opened its Open Cup season with a 6-1 route of the PDL's Carolina Dynamo. The team scored three goals in each half, as Billy Schuler (2), Brian Shriver, Jon Orlando, Tiyi Shipalane and Matt Fondy all found the back of the net.

Additionally, Macklin Robinson, Marcel Kandziora and Dre Fortune all made their first start for NCFC.

NCFC continued its Open Cup season with a 4-1 victory over the Charlotte Independence. James Marcelin recorded his first Open Cup goal on the only score of the first half. Connor Tobin also scored his first goal of the season, adding to a Nazmi

Albadawi second-half brace.

The win against Charlotte clinched a match with the Houston Dynamo, marking the fifth time in six years that NCFC has hosted a MLS team. The match against the Dynamo was a toe-to-toe affair with neither team able to pull away from the other after 90 minutes. After NCFC's extra-time chance was denied, Houston took the lead in the 109th minute and held on for the win.

The club finished its Open Cup season with a 2-1 record, while outscoring its opponents 12-5.

Carranza, del Rosario, Perez Represent U.S U18

Jose Carranza and Capital Area RailHawks Manny Perez and Lucas del Rosario are becoming key pieces for the U.S. U18 youth national team. The trio led the U.S. U18 team to a second-place finish in the Slovakia Cup on April 28.

All three are now back in the U18 camp again from June 8-19 in Lisbon, Portugal for the Lisbon International Tournament. The U.S. will play Portugal, Norway and Japan in the tournament. The team with the most points after the matches will be crowned champions. The NCFC trio are three of 11 returnees from the national team's previous camp in April.

U16/18 Academies Bound for U.S. Soccer Playoffs:

Both the U16 and U18 Capital Area RailHawks Academy teams are bound for the U.S. Soccer Developmental Academy Playoffs. The competition features the best academies in the nation. NCFC's Academy was one of 21 to place teams in the playoffs for both age groups.

The EPL is Coming to the Triangle:

North Carolina FC announced that they will face Swansea City A.F.C. of the English Premier League, England's top tier of soccer, in a marquee exhibition on Saturday, July 22 at 7:30 pm at Sahlen's Stadium at WakeMed Soccer Park.

Swansea City, formerly known as Swansea Town, is a Welsh professional football club based in the city of Swansea, South Wales. The club was founded in 1912 and joined the football league in 1912. After playing many years in lower divisions, in 2011 the club became the first Welsh team to play in the English Premier League since the League's formation in 1992. Swansea celebrated its greatest success thus far by winning the Capital One Cup in 2013

The English Premier League is the most popular league in the world, and this match will be a remarkable event for the Triangle. Broadcast in over 200 countries, the EPL boasts one of the largest fan bases on the planet. Having this event at WakeMed Soccer Park continues a North Carolina FC tradition of hosting high-profile teams from all over the world.

Sahlen's Stadium at WakeMed Soccer Park

The North Carolina Football Club, along with the Town of Cary, announced a new sponsorship deal with Sahlen Packing Company on March 31. As part of the deal, the main stadium at WakeMed Soccer Park was renamed Sahlen's Stadium. Additionally, Sahlen's is the exclusive hot dog provider to the stadium.

The Sahlen family owned the 2016 NWSL Champion Western New York Flash, which was acquired by the North Carolina Football Club in January of 2017 and subsequently re-branded as the North Carolina Courage. On April 29, the club will honor the Sahlen family with a pre-game ceremony highlighting their championship season and contribution to the sport.

CASL and TFCA Enters a Historic Strategic Collaboration with North Carolina Football Club:

In early March, North Carolina Football Club announced that it entered a historic collaboration with the Capital Area Soccer League (CASL) and Triangle Futbol Club Alliance (TFCA), resulting in the largest youth-to-professional soccer club in the United States. CASL and TFCA rebranded as North Carolina FC Youth beginning this season, and will complete the transition this summer. North Carolina FC Youth will take the field in the fall wearing the NCFC crest on their jerseys.

A combined 61 years of soccer management, coaching and on-field success between CASL and TFCA will ensure North Carolina FC Youth will offer the best player development and training opportunities to players of all ages and abilities. The combined resources will allow soccer to grow in our area by attracting talented coaches and players, providing a clear pathway to professional soccer, and fostering a sense of connection between youth soccer and the professional team among many other benefits.

Offseason signings:

During the offseason, North Carolina Football Club President and General Manager, Curt Johnson, was busy bringing new key pieces to the club. North Carolina FC signed Saeed Robinson, Alex Molano, Christian Ibeagha, Marcel Kandziora, Bolu Akinyode, Lance Laing, Dre Fortune, Matias Reynares, George Marks, and Jose Carranza.

Robinson, Molano, Kandziora, Akinyode, Laing and Fortune are all midfielders who are expected to make a huge influence on the field for North Carolina FC.

Laing, a former member of FC Edmonton and the Fort Lauderdale Strikers, is the first NASL player to be named to the NASL's Best XI three times, while Fortune is the first Capital Area RailHawks Development Academy player in the organization's history to sign a professional contract with the first team

Molano is a versatile midfielder who appeared in 17

regular season games for the Swope Park Rangers of the United Soccer League in 2016. The 24-year-old led North Carolina FC in the preseason, with three goals in five games.

Robinson and Akinyode spent the 2016 season playing in the USL, for the Colorado Springs Switchbacks and Bethlehem Steel FC, respectively. Kandziora is a German international who has experience with various teams in the German 2. Bundesliga.

Ibeagha is a former Duke Blue Devil who played with Robinson last season with the Colorado Switchbacks. The 6-foot-2 Nigeria native appeared in 30 games as a defender, contributing one assist and amassing 2,656 minutes.

Reynares is an 18-year-old goalkeeper who signed his first professional contract with the Fort Lauderdale Strikers last year for the 2016 season. Reynares split time with the first team as Bruno Cardoso's backup and with the Strikers' NPSL squad.

Marks is a 17-year-old Raleigh native that is a product of the Capital Area RailHawks Academy. The goalkeeper started playing soccer at the age of six and worked his way through the CASL system, until he reached the U-15/16 Capital Area RailHawks team in 2015. Since then, he has started 30 games for the U-15/16 and U-17/18 teams.

Carranza is an 18-year-old midfielder who is coming to North Carolina Football Club from the Academy Team of D.C. United of Major League Soccer. The Manassas, Virginia native played for their U-16 and U-18 academy teams, where he started in 20 games throughout the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 seasons.

Carranza came up through the ranks for the United States, playing for their U-14 through U-18 teams. He was recently one of only 28 players invited to train at the U-18 Men's National Team 2017 training from Jan. 23-30 in Bradenton, Fla.

We became North Carolina Football Club:

In December, Owner Steve Malik and President and General Manager Curt Johnson ushered in a New State of Soccer by announcing several initiatives bolstered by a bold new brand with a modern vision for soccer in the Triangle and North Carolina. The initiatives center around bringing the highest level of men's and women's professional soccer in North America to the Triangle.

In conjunction with the brand repositioning, the Carolina RailHawks were renamed North Carolina FC (referred to as NCFC), and received a new crest and colors. Malik also grew the North Carolina Football Club family by bringing the Triangle an NWSL team, the North Carolina Courage, in January.

NORTH CAROLINA FC HEAD COACH COLIN CLARKE

Colin Clarke enters his sixth season as head coach of the North Carolina FC after being appointed to the position on December 6, 2011. Clarke signed a new multi-year contract with the organization on 2014. This contract makes Colin Clarke the longest tenured head coach in franchise history.

Prior to joining the organization for the 2012 NASL Season, Clarke enjoyed successful seasons with league rival the Puerto Rico Islanders and FC Dallas of Major League Soccer. After a successful professional and international playing career, Clarke was hired to his first head coaching job with the Richmond Kickers by then Kickers General Manager and current North Carolina FC President Curt Johnson in 1998. In his first season, Clarke led the organization to a fourth place league finish accompanied by a run to the NASL Semifinals and a historic run in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup highlighted by a victory over the 2011 and 2012 MLS Champion, LA Galaxy.

In the newly formatted 2013 NASL Regular Season, Clarke led the team to accumulate the most points over the Spring Season and Fall Season with an overall record of 12 wins, 7 ties, and 7 losses in league play. In 2013, Clarke and the team once again defeated the LA Galaxy in the Third Round of the U.S. Open Cup and avenged their Fourth Round loss in 2012 with a 3-1 victory over Chivas USA. The trip to the Quarterfinals of the 100th Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup was NCFC's longest run in the annual tournament since their Semifinal run in 2007.

Over his two seasons in charge, Clarke led the Kickers to a 38 - 18 record. During the 2003 Major League Soccer season, Clarke took over as head coach of the Dallas Burn (later named FC Dallas) and turned around the club's fortunes, leading the club to a Western Conference first place finish in 2006. In 2007, Clarke joined the Puerto Rico Islanders. His tenure in Puerto Rico was highlighted by a league regular season championship in 2008 and a historic run to the semifinals of the 2008-2009 CONCACAF Champions League before losing to Cruz Azul in a penalty kick shootout. For his accomplishments over the course of the 2008 season, Clarke was named the league's Coach of the Year. In 2010, Clarke's Islanders made headlines in Champions League play once again when they defeated the LA Galaxy 4 — 1 at the Home Depot Center. Following their Champions League success, the Islanders went on to defeat NCFC in the USSF-D2 Pro League Championship Final. Clarke left his tenure with the Islanders with a league regular season championship (2008), a league championship (2010), two CFU Club Championships (2010, 2011), and five consecutive playoff berths (2007-2011).

Prior to coaching, Clarke established himself as one of the top players from Northern Ireland representing the country in the 1986 World Cup and experiencing a twelve-year playing career in England. Clarke began his playing career with Peterborough United of the Football League Fourth Division in 1981 and quickly ascended to England's First Division spending time with Southampton, Queens Park Rangers, and Portsmouth until a knee injury ended his playing career. Appearing 38 times for the Northern Ireland National Team, Clarke recorded a World Cup goal, a hat-trick, and finished his career as the all-time leading goal scorer for Northern Ireland (13). Clarke finished his professional career with 147 goals in 436 matches.
